

**RACE SUICIDE HELD PRACTICED WIDELY**

College Graduates Accused by Health Official.

FIGURES ARE OFFERED

Educators Hear That Progeny of 1000 Will Not Exceed 50 in 1000 Years; Aliens Multiply.

DES MOINES, Ia., July 7.—An international congress of education to be held in 1922 was advocated today by Dr. Augustus O. Thomas of Augusta, Me., in submitting a report of the foreign relations committee to the National Education Association at its convention here.

"The large number of organizations engaged in international activities is evidence of the growing desire for a closer relationship between the people of the various nations," declared Dr. Thomas. He said that the committee has devoted most of its time to the study of international educational agencies.

He declared that the purpose of these agencies is to create a better understanding and to develop a greater sympathy among neighbors to correct false notions which the people of one nation sometimes have of another, and to promote free education among free peoples. It would be the purpose of this congress to develop a spirit of universal education and perpetual peace.

**Race Suicide Charged.**  
Race suicide is being practiced on a vast scale by American college graduates, declared in an address before the department of secondary education today.

He submitted a series of figures to substantiate his statement. "Investigation by the federal health service," he said, "over a period of years indicates that the progeny of 1000 graduates from such institutions as Harvard, Yale, Princeton, Vassar and Smith will not exceed 50 in 1000 years from now."

A similar investigation conducted among illiterate foreigners, he said, showed that in a like period the original thousand will be multiplied at least 100 times.

**Descendants Put at 50.**  
The ratio there will be, he said, 50 men and women descended from educated parents to 100,000 individuals begotten by ignorant parents.

Public appreciation of education has greatly increased during the last year, with the result that much headway has been made in the movement to obtain the sanction of a general department of education with a cabinet official as director. Hugh S. Magill, field secretary of the association, told the assembly this morning. Mr. Magill presented the annual report of the legislative committee.

Arthur H. Chamberlain (San Francisco) representing for the committee on thrift education, said that thrift is the foundation of character, and urged not only the conservation of natural resources, but conservation of health and time as well.

**IDEALS AND LEARNING LINKED**

Vice-President Coolidge Addresses American Classical League.

PHILADELPHIA, July 7.—Science, commerce and social conditions could not progress if our educational system dropped the classics of ancient civilization from its curriculum. Vice-President Coolidge today told the American Classical League, in session at the University of Pennsylvania.

Education is primarily a means of establishing ideals, the vice-president said, its first being the formation of character, which is the result of heredity and training. It is the ancient classics, he declared, that inspire the ideals toward which all men and nations are striving today.

"The most pressing requirements of the present time," the speaker asserted, "is not how are we to solve our economic problems, but where are we to find the sustaining influences for the realities of life? How are we to justify the existing form of government in our republic? On what can we rely for a continuation of that service of sacrifice which has made modern civilization possible?"

"The progress of the present era gives no new answers to these problems. There are no examples of heroism which rival Leonidas at Thermopylae or Horatius at the bridge. The literature of Greece and Rome is, from beginning to end, an inspiring plea for patriotism."

"Society is the product of all which has gone before. The principles and ideals on which we must depend not only for a continuance of modern culture, but, I believe, for continuance of the department of science itself come to us from the classics."

"Unless Americans shall continue to live in something more than the present, to be moved by something more than material gains, they will go down as other peoples have gone down before some nation possessed of a greater moral force."
