Mrs. Johnson was formerly Miss Pauline Benham, and was for a long time a nurse at Good Samaritan hospital, where which institution she was a graduate. Mr. Johnson was in poor health and was accompanying his wife to California in hopes of regaining his strength. He was a salesman for a wholesale grocery house of Olympia, Wash., for several years. His mother, Mrs. C. E. Van Duzer, resides in Park Rose and his sister, Mrs. Leola Culley, lives on Columbia boulevard. Jeff Johnson, a brother, was drowned when he was 13 years old.

Edwards on Way to School.

George Edwards, passenger on the sunken steamer, whose name does not appear among the list of survivors, was on his way to San Francisco preparatory to taking up his first year at the University of California. He graduated from Harvard Military academy at Los Angeles last spring.

Mr. Edwards is the second son of Mrs. Dwight Edwards, 739 Welder street, and is a brother of Dwight Edwards Jr., now head of the Dwight Edwards Coffee company.

Young Edwards is well known in Portland, where he was reared and where he attended school. He is a former Lincoln high school student and is 19 years of age. He is a descendant of Jonathan Edwards of Puritan days.

Mrs. Carrie Lange, whose name appears among the injured passengers of the wrecked steamer, is a former resident of Portland and was visiting with friends in this city previous to taking passage on the vessel for her home in San Francisco.

Mrs. Lange was married in April of last year to William J. Lange, president of the Wrigh-Lange Printing company, which was formerly located at 461 Washington street. Mr. Lange is now engaged in the paper business in San Francisco and he and Mrs. Lange have been making their home there.

Prior to her marriage Mrs. Lange was employed by several local firms as stenographer. For two years she worked for McKinley Mitchell, commission merchant, 262 Stark street.

Mrs. Lange's parents are now living in Wisconsin.
