Not Even 40 Days of Rain Check Interest.

MANY RECEPTIONS HELD

Chief Delegates to Conference to Start This Week for Seattle; Rice Harvest is Injured.

TOKYO, Oct. 9.—(By the Associated Press.)

The Washington conference on limitation of armament and far eastern questions has the center of the stage in Japan today. Not even 40 days of ceaseless rain, such as Japan never before has seen, has checked the interest displayed in the forthcoming departure of Japan's representatives to the conference.

Delegates Ready to Leave.

The steamers Hawkeye State, Golden State and Shinyo will leave this week for San Francisco, taking persons going to Washington, while the steamer Kashiwa, sailing for Seattle, will transport the chief Japanese delegates to the conference and the members of the Japanese business mission that will visit the United States.

Prices of Rice Sour.

The weather, which has ruined part of the rice harvest, has caused prices to soar, but still the exporters, and especially the shipbuilders, constantly are demanding higher wages and are getting them. Owing to the high cost of production, commerce continues to decline sharply.

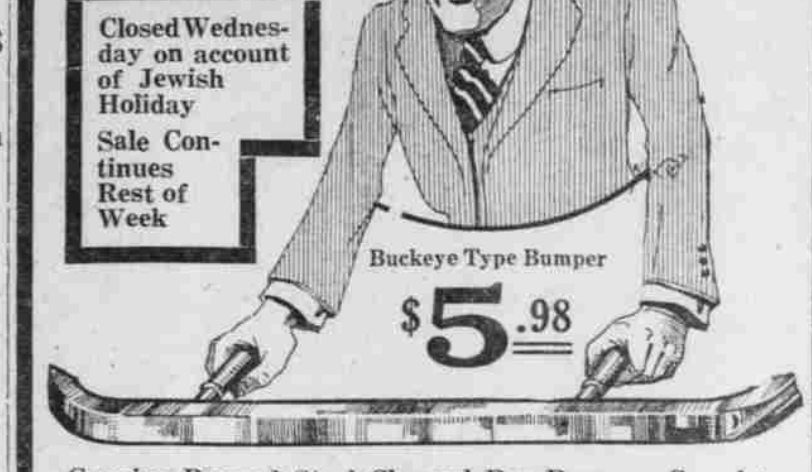
