FUND CARRY-OVER ARGUED

PRACTICE OF LIBRARY ASSOCIATION DISCUSSED.

Belief Expressed at Hearing of Tax Commission That Custom Can Be Made Legal.

The question of the legality of permitting the Portland Library association to carry over a substantial emergency fund each year amounting to approximately \$30,000 was raised at a hearing yesterday of the tax conservation commission held for the purpose of considering the budget of the library association.

It was pointed out at the hearing that the library association had been in the habit of carrying over an emergency fund each year.

The belief was expressed that the carrying over of the fund could be made legal by itemizing it on the budget.

The same condition prevails in the case of the dock commission and the conservation commission has not yet taken definite action on that matter.
