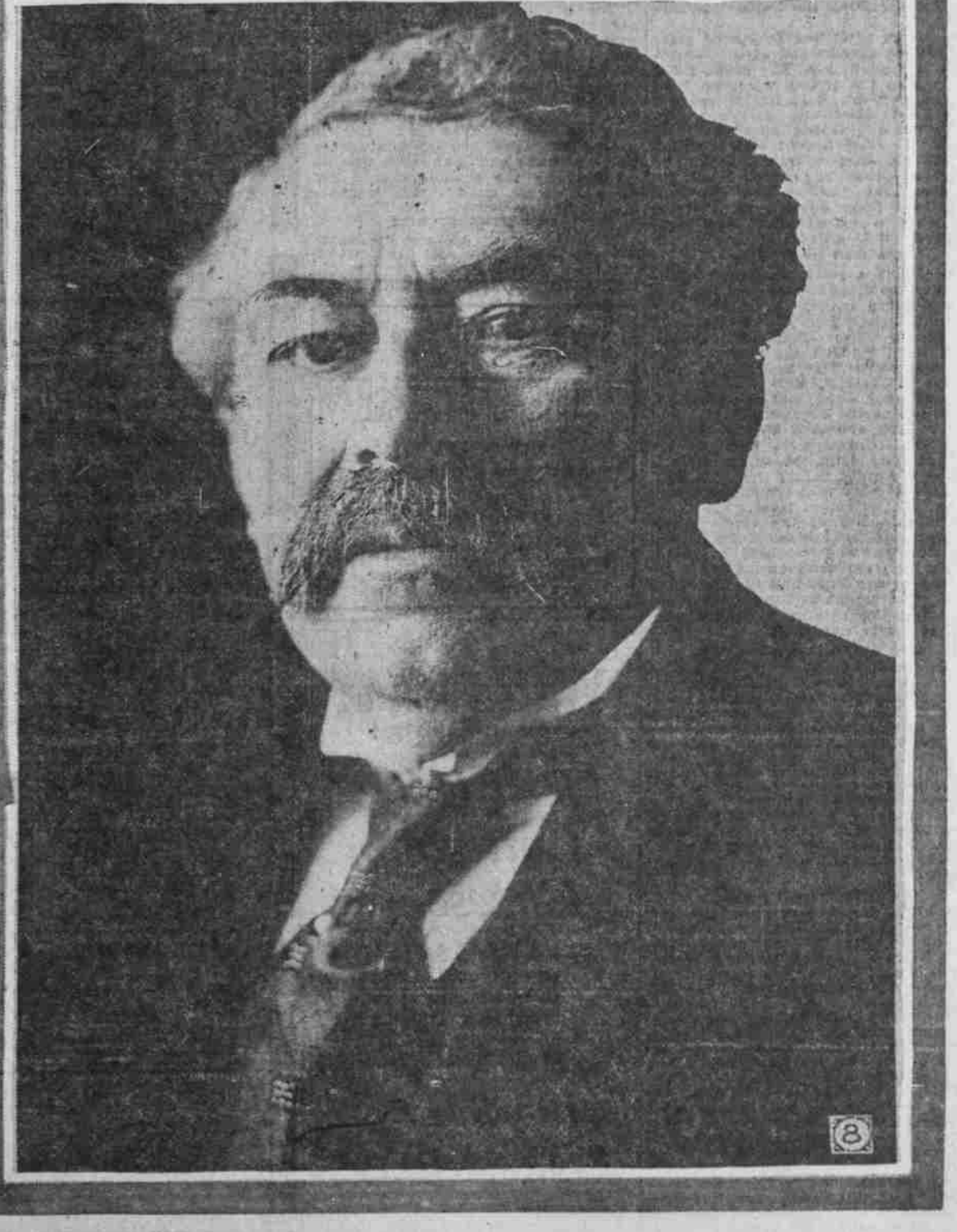


PAGE OF PICTURES FROM THE CONFERENCE AT WASHINGTON
