

CITY IS CHARMED BY MANY CONCERTS

Large Audiences Attend High Quality Programmes.

MUSIC-WEEK FEATURES TODAY. Police quartet concert in council chamber at city hall at noon.

From early yesterday morning when the work-a-day world was office bound until late last night when the pleasure-seekers were thinking of home, music predominated the community life of the city in observance of Portland's Music Week.

Concert at Y. M. C. A. Feature. One of the outstanding concerts of the day was that given at noon in the Y. M. C. A. auditorium by the Portland Flute Club.

Many Concerts Given. The concerts during the day were too numerous to mention. There was music in practically all of the larger business establishments, public buildings, hospitals, many churches and in a number of schools.

The Royal Rosarian band gave a concert in Washington high school, directed by Clarence H. Cook. There was a capacity audience in the auditorium of that building.

Many who enjoy military band music went to the auditorium in the evening to listen to the 39th regimental band. The band in concert was quite up to its reputation and even bettered the previous performances in Portland parades.

Except for those individuals who were sufficiently inspired by the music heard about town to go home and put favorite records on the phonograph or tickle the ivories in syncopation, jazz was a complete outcast for the day, and will so remain for the week.

Programmes of High Quality. All of the programmes were of high quality and imitations of jungle music and tom tom dances were nowhere to be heard.

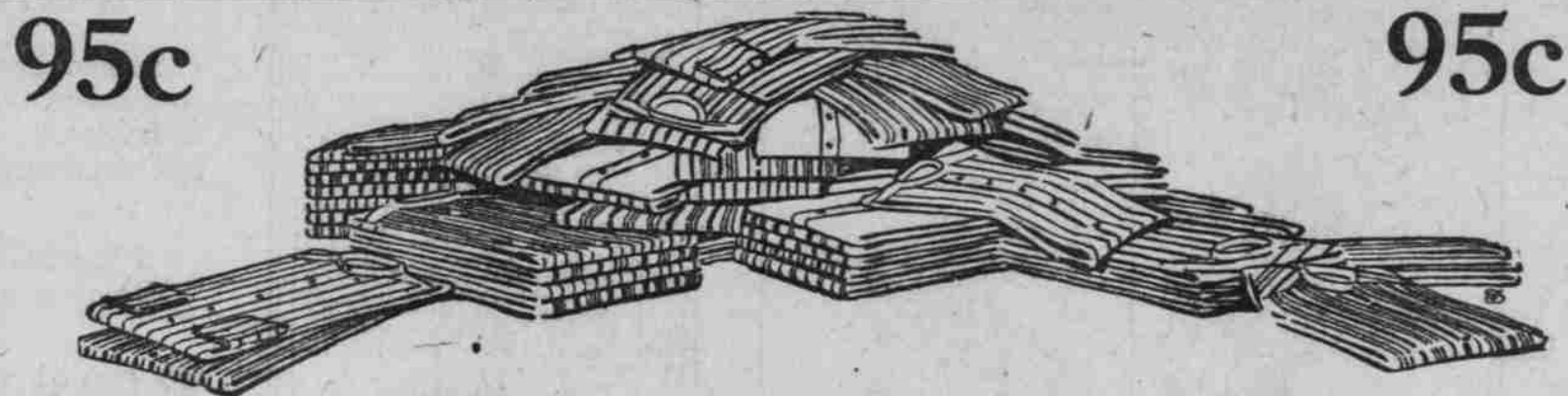
