

PUBLICITY AS BOOST TO BUTTER PLANNED

Oregon Association Opens Its Annual Session.

MANY DELEGATES HERE

Continued Improvement of Dairy Products Noted—Aid Pledged to Fight Creamery Appeal.

Continued improvement of dairy products and a campaign of advertising that will place before the consumer the true food value of such products were emphasized by the Oregon Butter and Cheese-makers' association yesterday at the opening day of its 12th annual session at the Multnomah hotel.

A special committee composed of P. M. Brandt, Oregon Agricultural college dairy department; R. E. Cavett of the White Clover Ice Cream company; and L. E. Ziemer, deputy dairy and food commissioner, were appointed by P. C. Jorgensen of Carlton, president to report today on advertising campaign for the association's membership.

The members of the association pledged themselves to employ an additional counsel to assist the United States attorney in an appeal of the Corvallis Creamery company which seeks to invalidate an Oregon law before the United States supreme court.

Close competition was announced in the cube butter display, which will receive a large number of awards. The eight highest ranked and 44 and 46 per cent with ties. Twenty-nine creameries exhibited. Announcement of scoring was withheld until the association met tonight at the Multnomah hotel.

County Taxes Decrease

Retrenchment in School District and Other Economies Make Decline Possible.

Multnomah county taxpayers will dig up \$41.50 in taxes during the coming year for every \$1000 in assessed valuation of property, compared with \$44.80 paid during 1921. The decrease is in spite of the fact that the valuation of property within the county has decreased approximately \$4,000,000 with the corresponding necessity for increasing the millage on the valuation remaining to absorb the depreciation.

The heaviest drop is in the amount required for the operation of school district No. 1 during the next 12 months. Last year \$1,111,887.74 was apportioned to the schools, compared with \$2,026,557.93 to carry on during the coming year, a cut of \$1,075,153.65. This decrease was made possible when the special building tax was voted down last fall.

City requirements under the new schedule are figured at \$372,994.89 less than was appropriated for the current year. This drop is next to that of the schools in size.

Multnomah county will be able to get along on \$1,052,422.21 less during 1922. It is figured, but the county school system will require \$327.33 more to operate, and the county library \$219.25 more. More money will be required for market roads—\$241.45—and the Port of Portland will receive \$171,277.56 more than it requires during 1922.

The commission of public docks will operate in 1922 on \$169,457.77 less than in 1921, and the amount turned over to the state from Multnomah county will be \$2,503,125.50 during 1922, compared with \$2,629,486.62 in 1921.
