

COUNTRY BANK WINS FEDERAL RESERVE BANK

Injunction Issued Against Reserve Institution. DISPUTE OVER EXCHANGE

Coercion, extravagance and unbusinesslike methods were laid at the door of the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco by Judge Wolverson yesterday morning in the district court when he granted an injunction restraining the government banking institution from harassing the Brookings State Bank of Brookings, Okla.

Higher Cost Admitted. In the original hearing the federal reserve bank officials admitted that it had cost them \$192,322 to collect \$192,359 from the small bank in the course of a year, whereas by following the usual method of paying a small fee for each exchange the bank could have been done much more economically.
