DISPUTE OVER EXCHANGE

Coercion and Extravagance Found by Judge in Dealings With Brookings Depository.

Coercion, extravagance and unbusi-ness-like methods were laid at the door of the Federal Reserve bank of Sati Francisco by Judge Wolverton yesterday morning in the district court when he granted an injunction restraining the government banking institution from harassing the Brookings State bank of Brookings, Or. The dispute between the two bank-

ing institutions came when the Brookings State bank refused to ex-change checks at par in accordance with a ruling of the federal reserve bank. The larger institution immediately sent an agent to Brookings, whose business was to make collections of all checks from the small

In the original hearing the federal reserve bank officials admitted that it had cost them \$1915.32 to collect \$102,850 from the small bank in the course of a year, whereas by follow-ing the usual method of paying a small fee for each exchange the work could have been done much more

letters to banks over the state calling attention to the fact that it refused to make collections on thecks drawn on the Brookings State bank. This brought about the suit for an injunc tion in which the small bank askeds the protection of the courts from fur-

Method Held Unbusiness-Like. In rendering his opinion Judge

"The method employed, considering the reasons for it, or rather the lack of reasonable secessity was, to say the least, extraordinarily extravagant and unbusiness-like."

Judge Wolverton also criticized the federal reserve bank for its efforts to coerce the small institution, which has only a capital stock of \$15,00 and is located in a remote section of Curry county. The decision is a decided victory for all small banks of the state,
