Another freighter due from the Atlantic coast, the Henry S. Grove, was due in the river last night. She is in the service of the Atlantic Gulf & Pacific line and has a large cargo of general freight for this port.

The Harry Luckenbach left New York on January 8 and reached San Francisco, just 17 days later. Considering the fact that she stopped at San Francisco to work cargo, her time to this port of 21 days was considered fast.
