OUTSIDE TEAMS HAVE ADVANTAGE IN ATHLETICS. Question of Refusing to Play With Schools Without Restrictions Agitates Country.

The question now debated at the University of California as to whether that institution will play teams outside the college conference, is not confined to California alone.

Most of the big university football teams, including Harvard, Yale, Princeton, the Big Ten conference and the Pacific coast conference, must abide by certain laws. For instance, the football teams may not begin practice until a specified date.

The one-year eligibility rule is enforced strictly. This means that no first-year man is eligible to compete in any sport until he has completed his university only three years.
