TRAMPS INCLUDED


Factor Is Encouraging in Market and May Prove Factor in Developing Better Conditions.

That there is a better demand for morthwest lumber in Australia than there has been for several months past is indicated by a table of lumber charters for the monthly period closing yesterday which has just been compiled by the Morchants Exchange. complied by the Morchants Exchange. The table, which includes all tramp vessels chartered for taking lumber from northwest points to Australia during the period, shows that a total of five of that type of vessel, in addition to regular line steamers, were booked. The number may be combooked. The number may be com-pared to the report of January, when only two tramps were booked to take lumber cargoes to the island conti-nent.
