C., Feb. 7.—Members of the Portland delegation to the shipping board meeting here learned for the first time since coming on to Washington that their petition for equal recognition in allocation of passenger cargo ships, presented last November, has been overruled, although no formal notice has been issued to them. They find that all the 502 type of steamers requested have been assigned to other runs; the shipping board did not seem to think it necessary even to inform Portland that their petition had been

Portland's representative on the committee summoned to Washinston for discussion of future shipping board operations on the Pacific, J. C. Alneworth, resched the capital today, accompanied by W. D. B. Dodson, general manager of the Chamber of

enterprise.

The formal meeting of the committee from the Pacific coast with the shipping board is to be held tomorrow afternoon. At that time it is expected that the Pacific plan being prepared by the committee headed by Mr. Fleischhacker will be presented and discussed by the whole board.
