PHILADELPHIA. March 24.—(Special.)

Announcement is made by W. B. Storey,
president of the Atchison. Topeka & Santa
Fe system that his company will doubletrack its main line from Chicago to San
Francisco. This is the most welcome and

constructed to complete the double-tracking.
