

BEST SUREST CURE FOR TUBERCULOSIS

Expert of Colorado Springs Discusses White Plague.

RESEARCH IS NEGLECTED

Dr. Gerald B. Webb Brings Gross Failure to Forward Study of Plague National Scandal.

A tuberculosis germ, while admittedly a "dangerous little fellow," really has no intention, so far as has been learned through medical research, of killing "his host," according to Dr. Gerald B. Webb of Colorado Springs, Colo., past president of the National Tuberculosis Association and international authority upon this highly important subject.

Rest Declared Best Cure.

He was serious, but not sensational, and said that so far as has been disclosed definitely through known experimentation anywhere, "rest is the only sure thing discovered which has stood the test of time in restoring victims of pulmonary tuberculosis to health."

Research Has Been Neglected.

"The goal which all medical folk working on tuberculosis experimentation have in view and yet has not been attained, is a vaccination that will destroy the bacilli, as does our system of vaccination destroy the germs of smallpox and other diseases."

Money Lacking for Study.

What a pity that this great, rich nation has no funds to carry on the scientific study of a dread disease as tuberculosis. Think of the money, the brains and the time we spend upon contrivances for destruction, as in war, and then compare it with what we are doing to save mankind from tuberculosis and other enemies."

Rest Essential to Recovery.

"We have found that in pulmonary tuberculosis patients should be carefully advised how to rest," said Dr. Webb. "A woman who was sent to us recently with instructions from her physician that her right lung should be collapsed, and whom he ordered to rest, was lying on her left side all the time, thus forcing the diseased side of the lungs to do all the work."

More Practitioners Needed.

Dr. Webb and other speakers of the day emphasized the need of more general practitioners. He said that if the large percentage of tuberculosis victims are to be properly cared for they must be able to obtain physicians of experience and knowledge of how to treat this disease. These, he said, only can be trained through such institutes as this one and by similar means.

Preventive Rehearsal Urged.

An earnest plea for the restoration of the prestige of the medical profession in every city and urban community as it existed when the old-fashioned country doctor used to administer to folk during a night session under the auspices of the City and County Medical Society, when Dr. McCormack addressed a capacity audience in the green room of the Chamber of Commerce.

"We must take care of the folk in the country, the big cities and have every-thing that goes to make life worth living," Dr. McCormack declared the sort of educational training which had failed to enable the medical profession to master disease and keep people well, and blamed himself and others in the profession who, he said, "must revise the work so that complete confidence will be restored and so folk will get what they want most—cures for their ailments instead of a lot of high-sounding diagnoses without cures."

WIFE PROTESTS WAGE CUT

SPOUSE OF SECTION HAND ITEMIZES LIVING COSTS.

Witnesses Declare They Are Underfed and Underclothed Even on Present Railroad Scale.

CHICAGO, April 12.—Human exhibits to prove that maintenance of way railroad employes cannot live properly on their present pay today were brought before the United States railroad labor board hearing into the road's demand for wage cuts when Frank P. Walsh, union attorney, called to the witness stand a number of employes who told the board their present earnings kept them underfed, underclothed and lacking some of the necessities of life.

Mrs. Joseph Saboni, wife of a Milwaukee section hand, was the first witness called by Mr. Walsh. She told the board that she had to borrow the old coat she wore to make the trip here. At the end of her story she turned to the board members and said:

"I know that you won't cut my husband's pay when you know we can't live on what he's getting now."

Mrs. Saboni said her husband's earnings last
