OLYMPIA, Wash., April 18 .- (Spe cial.)—Seattle's total of warrant and bonded indebtedness at the close of the year 1921 was in excess of \$61,-000,000 according to the annual report of the city controller. The report shows 27,667,400 of utility bonds outstanding. \$16,354,400 of general bonded indebtedness and \$17,592,011 of warrant in-

ourrent funds cash totaling \$686,542.37, cash construction funds totaling \$5,600,653.82 and trust funds, including L. L. D. guaranty, L. L. D. contingent and L. I. D. funds, \$1,012,-22,12

The city's \$2,519,858.24 interest paid during 1921 was divided as follows. Revenue bonds, \$1,147,976.60; general bonds, \$757,199; general warrants, \$92,580.21; L. D. warrants, \$515,-\$92,80.21; L. L. D. warrants, \$518,588.22; revenue warrants, \$6214.31.
As items of cost to the city last year the following were listed: Police department, \$1,163,255.88; fire department, \$1,828,578.19; street department, including L. I.
