Skyscraper House of Worship About Complete.

New Edifice Built More or Less on Business Lines Declared to Be Ideal One.

NEW YORK, April 18.—(Special)—It is merely one more proof of New York city's tremendous and steady growth when a church applies architectural and structural principles, the principles of the skyscraper to its new edifice and when, following the march of progress, it moves a mile further up town.

The Fifth-avenue Baptist church is the first religious organization here to build a skyscraper house of worship, one that is devoted solely to religious and social gatherings and which does not include church office space.

In order to change its location it has been necessary to change the name of the church which is not unusual when a church is designated by the name of a special street or block or section of the city in which it is situated.

The Fifth-avenue Baptist church started its career on Norfolk street and under another name back in 1821. Until 1859 the congregation continued to worship at the east side center.
