

RESULTS UNCHANGED
IN RECHECK OF VOTEVariations Only Slight in
Multnomah Figures.

WALTER EVANS ADVANCES

Revised Figures Are 19,443 for
Evans and Hawkins 19,351.
Clark and Banks Close.

Recheck yesterday of figures on the closely-contested offices in the Multnomah county returns made no changes in results and only slight variations in the totals published yesterday. The recheck was made on figures taken by The Oregonian late Saturday and entirely independent of this newspaper's earlier count, giving a double check on the figures that are particularly close.

The complete unofficial returns on governor in Multnomah are:

Hall 19,196
Olcott 18,303

This gives Hall a plurality in this county of 893, which is a gain of 40 votes for him over the earlier figures.

Evans Makes Slight Gain.

Walter H. Evans also gained slightly on the re-check. In the contest between him and Martin W. Hawkins for circuit judge in department No. 4, the revised figures are:

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Another tight place on the republican ballot is on joint senator from the counties of Multnomah, Clackamas and Columbia. There has been no doubt from the first but that W. J. H. Clark had a substantial lead over W. W. Banks in this county. The question has been whether this lead was sufficient to offset any advantage held by Banks in both of the other counties. The re-checked figures vary only slightly from the original totals and still give Clark the nomination. The figures from the three counties are:

Result Not Yet Certain.

This lead of 266 for Clark is not enough to be definite until the official count is made. There is always a chance of small variations between the official and unofficial counts, and newspapers make their tabulations from the official statements that are supplied by the counting boards in all precincts. The official count, however, is taken from the original tally sheets. Usually it is found that the election boards have made some mistakes in copying the figures onto the statements, so that exceptionally close results are never certain until the official count is completed.

Out of 27 candidates, endorsed by the Oregon Federation of Patriotic societies, the orange ticket, 25 were nominated. On this ticket were four candidates who had no opposition and who were on all of the many tickets issued by groups and organizations, these being Eugene C. Linton, W. J. H. Clark, and J. L. G. Linton, and a circuit judge and county auditor.

Voting Strength Is 18,000.

Analysis of the vote cast in the republican primaries of Friday discloses that the voting strength of the federation, which also includes the Ku Klux Klan, in Multnomah county is about 18,000. The candidates on their ticket received more votes than that and some considerably under, but apparently the vote for the federation and its allies was about 18,000. The lowest man on the orange ticket for the legislature is Herman A. Lewis, 16,847, and he was defeated, the only loss sustained by the house end of the legislative ticket.

There were numbers of candidates endorsed on the orange ticket who were not on the ballot, such as K. K. Kubi, W. A. Woodward, Mrs. Simmons, C. G. Brownell, O. B. Huxton, L. H. H. Huxton, and G. L. G. Linton, so that the total vote of those candidates cannot be credited to the Klan and federation. High man on the legislative ticket is Thomas H. Hurlbert, who is practically unknown in Portland, being a retired eastern Oregon farmer who came here a few years ago and has been in the city since with civic activities. He was undoubtedly elected because his name is so similar to that of Thomas M. Hurlbert, the sheriff. Several years ago there was another Hurlbert elected when he had dodged out of the state and was repudiated by the republican party organization. Officially, but notwithstanding this stand taken by the party leaders, who recommended a democrat in preference, the candidate named Hurlbert was elected.

25,000 Votes Predicted.

In the primary campaign supporters of the orange ticket had predicted that they would cast about 25,000 votes in Multnomah county.

The Hall vote, which represents the Ku Klux Klan and federated societies' strength, gives an indication of what the federation has its stronghold. Roughly speaking, the Hall strength came in the outlying sections. The Olcott vote was in the center of the city, on Portland Heights and in Irvington. It was a horse race between Olcott and Hall in the Laurelhurst district.

Olcott failed to get a single vote in one precinct, and a similar thing occurred to Hall. In precinct 29, Fifth and Burnside, Hall did not get a vote, nor did Franklin F. Krell, the yellow ticket candidate for congress. In the precinct at Sauvie Island Hall received 10 votes, Olcott carried 188 precincts out of the 425 in the county. In a dozen precincts Hall and Olcott ran a dead heat and in many others Hall or Olcott carried by one or two votes.

On the west side Olcott carried most of the precincts but a different tale was told on the east side and especially in the suburban districts.

Orange Supporters Loyal.

In the main the supporters of the orange ticket followed it with blind faith but there were enough defections to result in a split. This was shown by a survey of the votes in the congressional contest and comparing them with the vote which Hall received in the same precincts. This defection is also responsible for the defeat of Leslie E. Crouch and Martin W. Hawkins, yellow ticket candidates for the circuit bench, and for the failure of John F. Wilson for state senator.

Why H. A. Lewis should lose out and be the only one defeated for the lower house in the list of yellow ticket candidates when other candidates on the same ticket not so well known as this former member of the senate, is not clear. The runs of
