Navy Officers Deny That Warship Hit Vessel Which Races for Dock in Harbor.

Captain Johnson reported that he was rammed by the United States navy submarine H-7, which proceeded seaward after the collision and he did not know whether it was damaged

The Virginia Olsen was struck three feet below the water line, according to Captain Johnson.

The denial of the charges against the H-7 was based upon a radio message received from Lieutenan W. E. Griswold, in charge of the submarine, stating that the H-7 did not have any collision, Captain Miller said.
