

SEATTLE TO SEAT NEW MAYOR TODAY

Dr. Brown to Tackle Street-Car Problem First.

SHAKEUP IS SCHEDULED

Women Will Take Places in City Council for First Time; War on Drug Peddlers Aim.

PUGET SOUND BUREAU, Seattle, Wash., June 4.—At noon tomorrow the city government of Seattle passes from the leadership of Hugh M. Caldwell to that of Dr. Edwin J. Brown, recently elected mayor, after one of the liveliest of Seattle's always lively municipal contests.

Dr. Brown was struck by the determination announced by Caldwell to discuss publicly the places to be filled by his appointment will give the town office. That he has given much thought to these places is generally known, and it is a safe prediction that the changes to be made, considering the limited number of appointments controlled by the mayor, will be "sweeping."

A new chief of police must be named at once, since W. H. Seaman, Mayor Caldwell's chief, resigned yesterday and at once resumed his rank as captain in the police department. He will be succeeded by William B. Seaver, Seattle.

MANCHURIA IS INVADDED

WU'S ARMY REPORTED TO BE NEAR CHINCHOW FU.

Some Troops Advance Along Mukden Railroad; Chinese Gunboats Leave Taku.

PEKING, June 4.—The troops of General Wu Pei-Fu have invaded Manchuria, it was announced today in official circles that Wu Pei-Fu's main army, which was sent in pursuit of Chang Tso-Lin, the Manchurian warlord, had reached a point near Chinchowfu, 150 miles southwest of Mukden, after marching overland.
