

TRAIL WORK PROGRESSES

OREGON NATIONAL FOREST SYSTEM DEVELOPING.

Forty Miles of Roads and Other Routes Under Development for Summer Completion.

Work on approximately 40 miles of roads and trails in the Oregon national forest will be completed this summer. Men are at work now and unless forest-fire conditions become more critical, many old trails will be improved and new routes laid out.

Work which has been begun by the Portland, Railway, Light & Power company along the Clackamas river will be extended by the forest service eight miles, near to the Oak Grove ranger station. The trail system south of this will be built more than ten miles to connect with the present trails on the Santiam river. The new trail will be over a water grade its entire length.

From the point where the Eagle creek and Lost lake trails join, near Waikum lake, a spur will be constructed to Mount Defiance, seven miles distant. For the protection of the Oregon City watershed a new trail will be built from the south fork of the Clackamas river; and likewise for the protection of the Portland watershed a trail will be laid out five or six miles down the Bull Run river.

Work is under way on a trail from Tawney's hotel up the Salmon river toward Mount Hood. This will be ten miles long.

Road work in the national forests is progressing in various sections. The skyline road will be built from a point five miles south of Clackamas lake ten miles to what are known as the Olalla lakes, north of Mount Jefferson. Work is progressing favorably along the Lost lake road. The road is being regraded in places and where it is found necessary rock is being spread. Part of this road outside the national forests will be reconstructed. A portion of it will be extended along the east shore of the lake so as to open the location for summer homes.

A survey is being made for a spur to connect the proposed Mount Hood loop with Cloud Cap Inn and the American Legion camp. This will be Cooper spur, a dirt road turn-out and rock reinforcement where it is needed.

FIRE DESTROYS 2 BOATS

O-W. R. & N. Grain Carriers

Burned at Loss of \$50,000.

LEWISTON, Idaho, July 12.—(Special.)—Fire of unknown origin destroyed the steamers Lewiston and Spokane at their Snake river docks here this morning. The boats were owned by the O-W. R. & N. and

were used in transportation of wheat between Asotin and Riparia, connecting with the railroad at the latter point.

A watchman employed on the boats barely escaped with his life. The fact that the boats were not in use and no fires were aboard, gave rise to reports of incendiarism. The estimated loss to the company is \$50,000. More than \$15,000 was expended last year in repairs to the Lewiston.

MAIMED DOGS LINE ROAD

Columbia Highway Presents Pitiful Sight to Observer.

HOOD RIVER, Or., July 12.—(Special.)—The Columbia river highway is lined with maimed and lost dogs, according to J. R. Nickelsen, supervisor of maintenance who patrols the route daily. He suggests that the humane society should take steps to prevent the careless transportation of dogs by automobiles.

"I have recently seen a dozen or more dogs, apparently animals that have been knocked from the running boards of machines on a curve or otherwise," says Mr. Nickelsen. "Some of them are fine looking animals. Several had been badly crippled by the falls, and others were physically exhausted in running after the disappearing machines of their masters. The animals present a pitiful sight."

DEFEATED MEN TO DINE

Candidates Who Lost in Recent Primary Will Eat Together.

Defeated candidates of the last primary election will assemble around the dinner table in the Multnomah hotel at 6:30 o'clock tonight, sympathize with one another, and tell "how it all happened," and eat. The committee in charge of the affair sent out invitations to which 25 have responded. "Forty Feet to Sea" Shepherd, who was lost in the primary, has had charge of the arrangements for the dinner. No man among the defeated could be decided upon for toastmaster, so it was agreed to get an "outsider," Joseph Singer and George W. Joseph were suggested and the latter won the gavel.

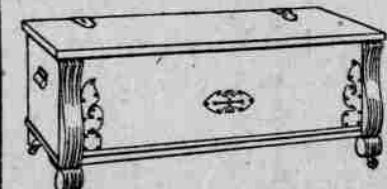

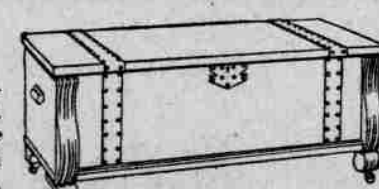
