M. Cohen to Confer With Orthodox Jews on Movement to Cement Ancient Faith.

Samuel M. Cohen, executive of the United Synagogue of America, with Mrs. Cohen, making a tour of the United States in the interest of traditional Judaism, arrived in Portland last night for a several days, during which he will confer with orthodox Jewish city in an endeavor to knit the ties of the ancient Jewish faith. The United Synagogue is a national federation of orthodox and conservative Jews of the United States. Mrs. Cohen, also an active worker, is a member of the Women's Council of the United Synagogue. Jews are getting closer together in an effort to uphold their racial faith as against the new sect which has sprung up, and the rabbi last night declared his purpose is to work among orthodox people and make them Jews as well as good citizens. One of our aims is to promote Jewish education. Our United Synagogue is a member of the Americanization council. MAILED MISTREATED

GO MAYOR ACCUSES PROHIBITION AGENTS.

Degree Methods Declared Have Been Employed in Case of Frank Marcellus.

He denying that he had charged prohibition agents with drunkenness asserting that unnecessary force had been used in arresting him yesterday. Mayor Hess added that he was yesterday the victim of a struggle between federal prohibition officials and Oswego people he arrested Saturday night of Marcellus, 18-year-old youth of town.

A formal complaint signed by Hess will be presented to Director Linville today. Prohibition Agents Frank Hansen are accused of using degree methods on the youth attempt to make him discontinue the source of his moonshine.

Marcellus and another youth were arrested Saturday night by Marshal Madie and Constable McVey of Oswego. Marcellus showed fight and put up a battle when the officers attempted to take him to the Oswego lockup.

The two federal agents, Mayor Hess says, were in the town during the day, and, on learning of the trouble, went to the jail and demanded the custody of the prisoner. This was granted them, the mayor says, with the understanding that no force was to be used.

According to the story told Mayor Hess by Marcellus, he was taken to the outskirts of the town, asked for information regarding moonshine vendors about Oswego and when he refused to give it, was badly beaten by the two officials.

"I saw young Marcellus Tuesday, after he had been arrested, and he showed signs that he had been roughly handled," said the mayor. "Citizens were indignant and asked me to make a formal protest. This was drawn up and the facts of the affair stated."

"I did not charge that the prohibition agents were drunk. In fact, I am reasonably sure that they were not. But I do charge that Marcellus was roughly handled."

General denial of the charges was made yesterday by Prohibition Director Linville. If force was used, he said, it was merely enough to control the youth.

\$150 Reported Stolen.

He said the money was taken by a young robber flashing a nickel-plated revolver. He did not report the holdup to the police until more than an hour after its occurrence.

Fall Breaks Worker's Leg.

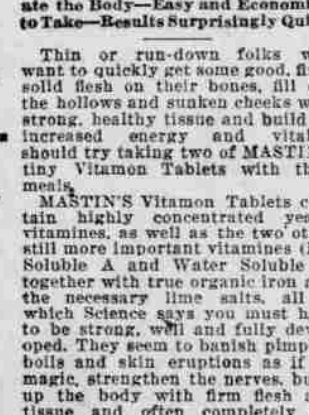
