

TOUR OF BONDS FIRMER

TRADING AT NEW YORK HAS BROADER SCOPE.

BUOYANCY DUE TO BETTER FOREIGN ADVICES AND IMPROVEMENT IN STOCK MARKET.

NEW YORK, July 12.—The firmer tone and broader scope of today's bond market resulted in part from better foreign advice and the upward trend of stocks.

Liberties again ranged higher, but no new records were made in that list. Improvement in foreign exchanges extended to European war flotations, both French and English.

Several of the industrial lost ground. General Electric is falling one point while Republic Iron declined 3/8 points.

Industrial conditions in New England were reported to be almost normal, especially in the textile and leather trades.

Call money rates, the lowest rate so far this month, local reserves being augmented by receipts from interior banks.

Although demand loans dropped to 3 1/2 per cent in the last half hour, that period was marked by heavy selling for profits.

French and Belgian remittances were carried about 20 points higher in the earlier part of foreign exchange and German marks gained three points.
