

SPEED COPS BEGIN DRIVE ON AUTOISTS

Careless Drivers Receiving
Attention of Police.

75 ARE FINED IN COURT

Bright Lights and Cutting Corners
Chief Target of Men
Working on Traffic.

A determined drive against speeders, reckless drivers and other autoists who fail to observe the common courtesies of the road has been started under the supervision of Lieutenant Ervin of the police speed squad and his six motorcycle officers.

An average of 75 persons a day has been arrested as far this week, and this number will be kept up indefinitely until the drivers generally learn that the state and city speed laws are made to be enforced.

Nearly 75 offending motorists were before Judge Ekwall in municipal court yesterday and paid fines aggregating about \$250. An equal number is scheduled for appearance in the same court today and for the remainder of the week if the motorcycle officers find as many violations as they have discovered so far this week.

Bright Lights Cause Arrests.

Failure to dim lights at night landed a number of motorists Monday night, and caused their appearance in court yesterday. Cutting corners and failure to give right of way at street intersections were the other two chief offenses which the motorcycle police observed.

During the day special attention will be made of the manner in which trucks and delivery cars run riot about the streets, and Lieutenant Ervin has directed his men to arrest all truck and delivery car drivers who show slight regard to the traffic laws.

In order to carry on the campaign against these motorists, who show such little regard for pedestrians and others, the speed officers for the past week have been working day and night, and will continue to do so until a decided change for the better is seen.

Carelessness Is Target.

"Although we are catching speeders the same as usual we are concentrating our efforts against the careless motorists," Lieutenant Ervin said. "It is the man who drives rapidly around a corner, cutting the corner by several feet and failing to watch for motorists at the intersections who causes most of the serious accidents."

"Traffic bureau records disclose that speeding causes fewer accidents than careless driving, and that is the reason we are going after the motorists who continue to violate these seemingly minor provisions of the traffic laws."

The speed squad likewise uncovered nearly 20 cases of fraudulent license plates during its drive against autoists. In many instances they found that heavy trucks were using license plates which were procured for Ford trucks, thus securing the heavier cost of the plates. All such cases were taken to court and prosecuted under the state law.

COYOTE HARVEST BIG

WAR ON PREDATORY ANIMALS HELD SATISFACTORY.

Government Worker in Oregon in Co-operation With State and County Officials Report.

The harvest of predatory animals in this state has been altogether satisfactory this fiscal year, ending June 30, states the report of Stanley G. Jewett, inspector of the biological survey. Coyotes numbering 2377, 388 bobcats, 3 timber wolves and 25 stock-killing bears have been either trapped, shot or poisoned by the government workers in co-operation with state and county officials during the past year. It is thought by the inspector that more were poisoned than were recovered. Not more than one coyote out of four is thought to have been recovered by the operators.

The bulk of the work for the year was carried on in the eastern Oregon livestock open range country in conjunction with agents furnished by the wool growers' association.

The woolgrowers have estimated that the work of the year has saved them \$140,000 when the damage that a coyote does in his lifetime is rated at \$50.

Financial co-operation has been received by the state sanitary livestock board and the county courts of Morrow, Wasco and Coos counties.

The greatest hindrance to effective work by the government agents has been the private bounty hunter who would spring and unbait government traps to save the coyote for himself during the fur season. Efforts have been made to revoke the bounties in some counties near the state lines. Hunters in other states have made practices of bringing their skins into Oregon counties to secure the greater bounty offered. It is felt by the biological survey that with greater financial appropriation by the state for salaried trappers and poison agents, effective work could be done satisfactorily controlling the coyote within a few years. This animal is by all means the most annoying to the stockmen.

PEACE TO BE PROMOTED

Women's Organizations of Oregon Join Anti-War Demonstration.

Women's organizations of Oregon are promoting the international no-more-war demonstration to be made next Saturday and Sunday, and among other things will telegraph President Harding at that time that he will be supported in taking further steps toward permanent peace. Mrs. G. L. Buland, chairman of legislative work of several of the organizations, is state publicity director for Oregon.

The no-more-war demonstration began on the continent of Europe in 1920 in three cities. Last year demonstrations were held in 200 cities in England, France and Germany, and this year ten nations of Europe have agreed to participate.
