

CHICAGO TRACTION
STRIKE IS SETTLEDUnion Heads and Operators
Compromise Differences.

GRAVE CRISIS AVERTED

Agreement Calls for 70 Cents an
Hour Wage and 8-Hour Day,
and Will Be Ratified.

(By Chicago Tribune Licensed Wire.)

CHICAGO, Aug. 4.—Chicago's traction strike was settled this evening when the company agreed to pay the men 70 cents an hour, with an eight-hour day. This was regarded as acceptable by the union chiefs and they agreed to it on behalf of the men.

Under the rules of the union the proposition must go to a referendum vote, but this is considered a formality and is now in progress. It is said the surface and elevated cars will all begin running Monday morning at 4 o'clock. The men had been getting 50 cents an hour and the company proposed to cut this to 45 cents an hour.

Bargain Struck Quickly.

The settlement came on the eve of what promised to be a day of many activities. The state industrial commission and the city council were to meet tomorrow and take up the entire matter. Mayor Thompson had arranged for a fleet of 40 automobiles to begin service Monday, various citizens' bodies were preparing drastic action and professional strikebreakers were arriving on every train.

In the midst of it all the company and union officials agreed the strike had gone far enough and quickly struck a bargain. The information was speedily disseminated throughout the city by the blowing of whistles, the screaming of fireboat sirens, the ringing of thousands of automobile horns and a system of fireworks signals from the municipal pier.

Chicago Amble Cheerily.

Meanwhile Chicago cheerily went to work to smother the strike without surface or elevated cars, making its way in automobiles, trucks, suburban trains, coastwise boats, bicycles, roller skates and horse-drawn vehicles.

Perhaps the most serious aspect of the strike today was the warning given by large department stores and other business establishments that they would be compelled to dismiss hundreds of employees Saturday unless the strike was settled or assurances given that it would be settled in a day or so. The great stores have been practically deserted for the last three days and merchants say the public has been buying nothing but bare necessities and buying in their small community stores in the suburbs.

Girls Prey of Hoodlums.

One of the unspeakable developments of the strike is the appearance in increasing numbers of hoodlums and "auto-pirates," who take advantage of girls who are seeking to get to and from their work. These "pirates" usually work in bands of three, a driver and two men in the back seat. The girls accept their invitation to be transported to her work or to her home, once inside the car it is driven to some alley off the prairie and the girl is attacked.

In one case late last night four of these hoodlums, evidently intoxicated, shot one of four girls after they had refused to enter the car. Other cases were reported today by girls who had been attacked and thrown from the cars at some lonely spot.

Adventurers Thrive in City.

A thirst for adventure and an insatiable craving for excitement of the spectacular sort, involving the risk of life and limb, accounts for the increasing number of adventurers arriving in the city eager for a job as strikebreakers.

These men come from New York, Cleveland and other eastern points. They have no capital, no home, but flock to any place that promises a battle. Money means nothing to them.

BRIDE-TO-BE IS SUICIDE

CRITICISM OF WEDDING AT-
TIRE CAUSE OF ACT.Girl Shoots Self When Father
Orders Her to Don Dress of
Less Decollete Cut.

GENEVA, Aug. 4.—(By the Associated Press.)—The story of a pathetic wedding tragedy yesterday in Geneva, Switzerland, was told by the Geneva newspapers today.

A wealthy widower named Kraus was about to give his 25-year-old daughter in marriage to an Austrian ex-officer. Kraus had made elaborate preparations for the ceremony which was to occur at noon, and had given his daughter a large dowry.

But when he first saw the girl's beautiful wedding dress he declared it was too décolleté, and told her he would not allow her to enter the church "half naked." He locked her in her bedroom and only relented to her pleading as far as to say she might go to the church in another gown. The daughter refused. The bridegroom arrived and passed. Later the father entered a revolver shot, entered the room and found his daughter's body lying across the bed, still clad in her bridal dress.

'SUICIDE WATCH' PLACED

SUSPECTED WIFE MURDERER
TO BE GUARDED.Man Believed to Have Hired Auto
Bandit to Do Killing Un-
ruffled by 3 Deaths.

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 4.—A "suicide watch" was placed today over Henry Wilkens, suspected of the murder of his wife, and the center of a tragedy in which Walter Castor shot out three lives, including his own, yesterday in a brief pistol fight with the police at the home of his mother, Mrs. Minnie Castor.

Although Wilkens, suspected of having caused the shooting to death of his wife by an automobile bandit, whom the police believe might have been Castor, apparently was not greatly affected by yesterday's tragedy, the police deemed it necessary to establish the watch.

Castor, who was also charged with murder of Mrs. Wilkens, was being sought throughout the country, when information to the police led to his being trapped in his mother's home. He shot and killed Detective Sergeant J. Bailey and his sister-in-law, Mrs. Robert Castor, and seriously wounded Ernest A. Gable. He then put a bullet into his own brain.

According to the police, Mrs. Minnie Castor was in a state of semi-consciousness and collapse tonight. She was taken to a hospital, but today's tragedy and although imperturbed by relatives and friends to leave the house, refused to do so.

DRINK PERMIT CANCELED

Council Acts When Deception by
Applicant Is Probed.

On Wednesday of this week the city commissioners voted a license to T. W. Mallory to conduct a soft drink parlor and cardroom at 26 1/2 Third street. Yesterday they rescinded that action because of deception on the applicant's part.

When the application came before the regular council session on Wednesday it was accompanied by an adverse report from the police department, one allegation being that Mallory had been in partnership with a man then in jail. Mallory denied that he had been in the restaurant, cardroom business, and that he knew the man named by the police. The commissioners agreed to take his denials at face value but rescinded the license when they found he had lied to them.

Probing of the police department branded the applicant as a liar and when he was yesterday brought before the commissioners he admitted that he had furnished money for the partner referred to and that he had been in business in the city before.

WILL WED AGAINWoman Divorced Twice in
Course of Last Year.

BRIDEGROOM LOCAL MAN

Third Matrimonial Voyage to Be

much newspaper space during the
past year, will again defy the odds

lowed. The two exchanged their vows at a marriage altar at Tur-

JOB SECURITY IS URGED

CITY CLUB MEMBERS TOLD
ABOUT WAGE TREND.Pay in Terms of What Money Will
Buy Declared Only Fair Ba-
sis for Employment.

With the aid of charts, Magnus W. Alexander, director of the national industrial conference, showed the members of the city club at the weekly luncheon at the Bevan hotel yesterday the trend of wages, cost of living, hours of employment and other factors that are being discussed by the industrialists of the nation and emphasized the point in his lecture that wages should not be considered in terms of money, but in terms of what the money will buy.

The security of employment is the biggest problem we have to face," he said. "It is not the wages that are the problem, but the security of employment. The best we can do is to strive to make the varying line of employment more certain and to cut out the great signposts which it has shown during the past few years."

Mr. Alexander also pointed out on his charts that the railroad worker is 40 per cent better off today than he was before the war. The conclusion was reached by a comparison of the present purchasing power of a dollar and the power it had before the war.

MILAN SCENE OF STRIFE

MUNICIPAL BUILDING TAKEN
—BY FASCIST PARTY.Storming Faction Led by Deputies;
Trouble Also Reported
in Other Italian Cities.

ROME, Aug. 4.—(By the Associated Press.)—The occupation of the municipal building in Milan by the fascist party is regarded as the gravest episode in connection with the strike here caused by the hostility between the fascist and the communist elements. A party of fascist first climbed upon the building and planted the tricolor on the balcony amid great cheering from the streets and cries of "down with socialism; viva Italy."

The iron gates of the municipal building were closed in an effort to prevent an invasion of the city government's quarters, but using an automobile as a battering ram, the fascists succeeded in smashing the gates and penetrating the building.

The storming parties were led by Luigi Langosco and Aldo Pini, fascist deputies.

At Padua the fascists raided the home of Dante Galiani, socialist deputy, charging that a shot had been fired at them from the house. Dr. Galiani is a well-known physician. The interior of the house was wrecked and the doctor, his wife and their children were forced to flee, escaping from a back window.

At Pistoia, in Tuscany, parties of fascist occupied the municipal building. In Asti and Padua the members of labor were set on fire and the villages of Pavesano, Debonco and Calappa, near Spezia, the socialist headquarters were destroyed.

Besides occupying the military and municipal buildings, bands of fascist attacked the editorial office and printing plant of the socialist organ Avanti.
