

BUS RIDER KILLS ONE, WOUNDS ONE

Slayer, Thought to Be Insane, Is Overpowered.

VICTIMS IN FRONT SEAT

Portland Man Dies After Shooting at Little Jack Falls—Other Is Brought Here.

One man was killed and another may die as the result of wanton revolver bullets fired by George Reberio, 29, during a lapse into insanity.

The dead man was Alvin R. Price, employe of the Union Oil company at Kelso, Wash.

The wounded man is R. Widing, 777 Burrard street, Vancouver, B. C. He has a fighting chance for life.

Victims in Front Seat.

Both men were sitting near the front of the stage, Price in the driver's seat, Widing in the second seat. Reberio was in the third seat.

When Widing turned and asked: "Why did you do that?" Reberio shot him twice, once in the back of the head and in the left side of the chest near the collarbone.

No witnesses of the actual shooting were in Portland Monday night, but the story was brought in by passengers on a Portland bound Columbia stage that should have met and passed Oathes' car at the time it occurred.

Account of Affair Given.

George Munro, driver of the Portland-bound stage, and J. White, passenger on Munro's stage, living at 965 Congress street, combined with others in giving an account of the affair about as follows:

The stage had reached Little Jack Falls, one mile north of Prescott between Goble and Rainier, when Reberio, without warning, commenced shooting.

Oathes immediately set his brakes and the injured passengers jumped from the machine to the road, out of danger.

Brakes Set by Driver.

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Oathes rushed to Rainier.

Oathes jumped into a private automobile and was rushed to Rainier, where he told the story to Sheriff Wellington.

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WIFE DECEASED TO SELL HUSBAND'S

OFFER ADMITTED BY ALL

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 21.—An offer by Mrs. Edith Spreckels Wakefield, first wife of the late "Jack" Spreckels, California millionaire, and herself prominent in San Francisco society, to "buy" another woman's husband from her for \$100 a month for the rest of her life came to light here today and is admitted by all persons involved.

The husband whom Mrs. Wakefield is credited with having offered to buy is Rodney Kendrick, a newspaper artist. The wife, who is ill and admits she is "considering" the offer, said today she already had given her wedding ring to Mrs. Wakefield.

Sick Wife Grateful.

A statement from Mrs. Wakefield tonight said: "It was a long time ago that I told Mrs. Kendrick that I loved her husband and wanted to marry him."

Husband Agrees to Bargain.

The wife said in a statement: "Mrs. Wakefield wrote me a letter five or six weeks ago when I was in a sanitarium asking me to come to her home in Sausalito. I had been there a year ago and I thought her motive was one of kindness and friendship."

PREFERENCE VOTE ABOLITION FAVORED
