

SERVICE ASSURED Japanese Line Will Make West Coast Ports.

FIRST STEAMER NOV. 8 Improved Outlet From Portland Is Promised by Additions of Carriers Announced.

Establishment of an independent service from American Pacific coast ports to those on the west coast of South America as far as Valparaiso, is announced by the Yamashita company to be started with the Japanese steamer Yoshida Maru No. 2, due here about November 8, and in inaugurating the schedule she will work a full cargo at Portland, Tacoma, Seattle, San Francisco, Los Angeles, San Pedro, San Diego, San Jose, and San Francisco, returning to Portland November 19 and the Nankoh Maru December 27, while the Gokoku Maru is slated to reach Seattle in the Puget sound-oriental line November 14, the Hokoku Maru December 5 and the Uralian Maru December 23.

Line Officials Return. The South American connection was made last night following the return from San Francisco of Y. H. Hiram, manager of the Yamashita Kisen Kaisha, and president of the Yamashita company, which was formed to handle American affairs for the home company in America, and E. McConlogue, Portland manager of the line. They met with J. J. Gorman, in charge of the Puget sound district.

Normal Trade Expected. Earlier information dealing with the resumption of copper mining, which is being urged by the revival of calls for mining timbers and other supplies, and in the movement of nitrates from the west coast to the United States, is substantially interested in advice to the Yamashita interests.
