

UNUSUAL ACTIVITY IS SEEN ON WATERFRONT

Six Big Steamers in Motion at Once Early in Day.

SIGHT IS PRETTY ONE

Growing Commerce of Port With All Sections of World Indicated by Movements.

Early risers along the waterfront were treated to an unusual sight yesterday morning about 7 o'clock when six steamers, a number of them large intercoastal and trans-Pacific liners, were in motion at once in the lower harbor in the vicinity of terminal No. 2.

The Columbia Pacific Shipping company's steamer West O'Leary, just arrived from the orient with general cargo, started the procession by coming upstream and slipping into a berth at terminal No. 1.

While these vessels were maneuvering the steamer Deerfield of the Elder & Dempster line's intercoastal service passed by, en route to the Willamette from Astoria.

At the same time the steamer Daisy Freeman, bound from Astoria to the Multnomah Lumber & Box company, to finish loading a cargo of lumber for California ports, passed upstream.

While the maneuvering of the six vessels was going on the lower harbor for several minutes looked busier than Washington street, at 5 P. M.
