JAPAN'S TRADE INCREASED Exports Far in Excess of Imports and Silks Biggest Item.

TOKYO, Nov. 15.—Japan's foreign trade during October amounted to 267,087,000 yen, of which exports were 141,881,000 yen and imports 125,206,000 yen, showing an excess of exports over imports by 16,675,000 yen, according to the finance office, compared with the trade of the corresponding period last year, which shows an increase of 32,244,000 yen in the exports and a decrease of 24,664,000 yen in the imports.
