

Frazier meets Foster Nov. 18 in title bout

Joe Frazier and Bob Foster signed contracts for a 15-round world heavy weight title fight for thrilling action Nov. 18. Frazier is the defending champion and Foster is the light-heavyweight title holder. Frazier was given a \$150,000 guarantee, or 40 per cent of the gate and 39 per cent of the ancillary receipts, which include T.V. income. Last June 23 he knocked out Jerry Quarry in seven rounds.

Foster, voicing confidence that his right would enable him to stop Frazier early, signed for 22½ per cent at the gate.

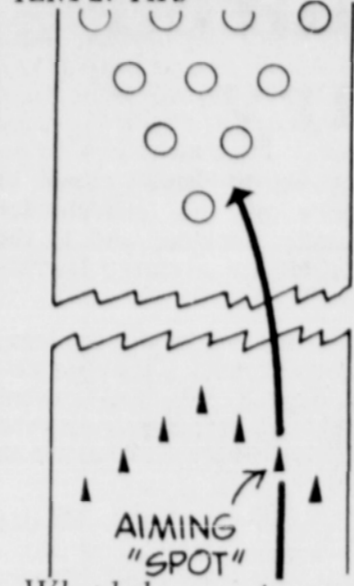

TEN PIN TIPS



What helps to make a smooth approach?

One of the chief things that encourages a smooth approach is spot bowling. Aim your ball at a target on the lane floor instead of aiming directly at the pins. Beginners, if not taught, want to aim at the pins—which is, after all, the final goal. But every bowler should learn to use the targets on the floor from the very start.

The concentration and control required to get your ball over a small spot on the lane—rather than whaling away at the broad target of the pins—forces you to keep your approach smooth and under control. Otherwise you may miss by a mile.

Black dealers organize

The National Black Automobile Dealers Assn. has been established as an autonomous body but it will maintain strong spiritual alignment with black-uplift groups, including Operation Breadbasket, the Urban League, and the NAACP.

The organization is, in fact, an outgrowth of discussions the Rev. Jesse Jackson, head of Operation Breadbasket, had with various black automobile dealers.

Perhaps nothing proves the need for this organization more than the following statistics:

There are more than 33,000 domestic and foreign automobile dealerships in America. Only 30 - less than one-tenth of 1 per cent - are blackowned. NBADA will demand of automotive leaders a sharp increase in the number of black dealerships.

Their significance to the overall black economy is quickly discerned when one realizes that NBADA dealerships represent more money, probably, than any other black organization in the country, excepting old-line black insurance companies.

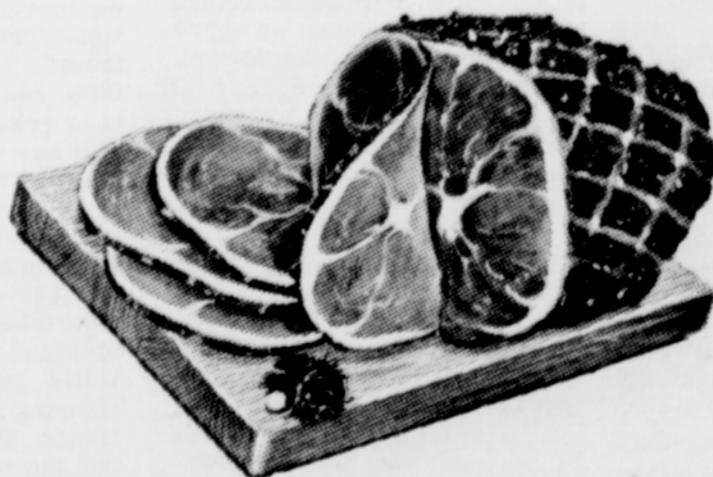
