#### **Frazier meets Foster** Nov. 18 in title bout

Joe Frazier and Bob Foster signed contracts for a 15-round world heavy weight title fight for thrilling action Nov. 18. Frazier is the defending champion and Foster is the lightheavyweight title holder. Frazier was given a \$150,000 guarantee, or 40 per cent of the gate and 39 per cent of the ancillary receipts, which include T.V. income. Last June 23 he knocked out Jerry Quarry in seven rounds.

Foster, voicing confidence that his right would enable him to stop Frazier early, signed for 222 per cent at the gate,

plus the same percentage of T.V. and other rights.

It is estimated that ticket sales in Cobo Arena would exceed \$500,000. Lou Handler, president of the newly formed 21 Century Productions, Inc., said the fight would be televised in 100 American cities and via satellite to foreign countries on colored circuits which should add at least \$1 million to the receipts.


Foster has run out of opponents in the light-heavy division and is stepping up a bid for big money.

#### **Black dealers organize**



Perhaps nothing proves the need for this organization more than the following statistics:

There are more than 33,000 domestic and foreign automobile dealerships in America. Only 30 - less than one-tenth of 1 per cent - are blackowned. NBADA will demand of automotive leaders a sharp increase in the number of black dealerships.

Their significance to the overall black economy is quickly discerned when one realizes that NBADA dealerships represent more money, probably, than any other black organization in the country, excepting old-line black insurance companies.
