The suburban transfer program, begun in 1968 to send children from the Albina area to schools in outlying districts, is really proving itself this year, according to Coordinator Donald Ross, and the Portland transfer students are becoming an integral part of their adopted schools. Dwayne Abraham. fourth grader from the Albina area who has been attending William Walker Elementary School in Beaverton for the past three years, has been chosen student body vice-president by his classmates. Terry Pierson, sixth grader, has been elected student body president of Menlo Park Elementary in the David Douglas School District. Terry, formerly a student at Martin Luther King School in North Portland, has been attending the David Douglas school on the transfer program since the fourth grade.

Currently running for school office is Dorene Larry, sixth grade girl from Eliot School who has been attending Lake Grove Elementary School since the fourth grade.

Donald Ross reports that about 96 Albina area students are taking part in the suburban transfer program this year, with children attending schools in the Beaverton, Lake Oswego, David Douglas and Parkrose school districts. He says the program has been growing each year, with the outlying districts continuing to ask for greater numbers of black children.


