A Code of Conduct

In 1858 The Carson, Pirie and Company of Chicago wrote a code of conduct for its four employees:

"Store must be open from 6 a.m. to 9 p.m. the year round. Store must be swept; counter base and showcases dusted, lamps trimmed, filled and chimneys cleaned; pens made; doors and windows opened; a pail of water, also a bucket of coal brought in before breakfast (if there is time to do so and attend to customers who call).

"Store must not be opened on the Sabbath, unless necessary to do, and then only for a few minutes.

"The employee who is in the habit of smoking Spanish cigars, being shaved at the barber shop, going to dances and other places of amusement, will surely give his employer reason to be suspicious of his integrity and honesty.

"Each employee must pay not less than \$5.00 per year to the church and must attend Sunday School regularly.

"Men employees (who are single) are given one evening a week for courting and two if they go to prayer meeting.

"After fourteen hours of work in the store, the leisure hours should be spent mostly in reading."

These rules surely sound humorous to us today. What busi-
