The house, located at 728 N. Shaver, five blocks from the school, is being purchased with Ford Foundation funds granted to the Portland school district for BEEP, a project begun this fall to involve students more actively in community life.

The small, two-bedroom house will be renovated by students as a study project. It will then be used for classes.

The nine students who will be visiting the title company Thursday selected the home being purchased. They had background classes with building inspectors and finance people, according to BEEP Coordinator Mrs. Bobbie Nunn.

Pioneer Title executive Fred Macy will conduct the students on a tour of the company and explain the procedures for buying a house. Students will begin renovation of the house when it is vacated by the present occupant.
