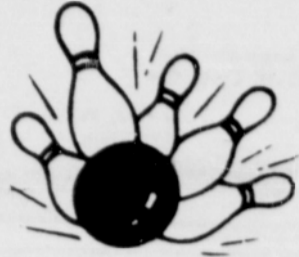

ment Corp. plant was opened under Mr. Clayton's direction at 7800 Susquehanna Street in Pittsburgh's Homewood section in December. It is now producing about 500 plaster units a day, and operating very successfully according to Mr. Clayton.

As manager of plant operations, he supervises the work of 19 people who cast the statues, finish, paint and dry them, then pack them for shipping. All of the employees received on-the-job training at the plant.

Naturally, there are many problems involved in such an operation, but Mr. Clayton has overcome most of them. Most of the people employed at the plant where either skilled or low skilled before going to work at BJD. Many had poor habits of work attendance, and had never held one job for a long period of time.

"Manufacturing is a new experience for most of our workers," Mr. Clayton said. "It's hard work, but they find it's very satisfying to see something they produced with their own hands. We have a rapport here that is beautiful."

The Pennsylvania Department of Community Affairs granted to help get the plant started, and to cover operations while 42 people are trained. At the end of that period, some time in 1971, it is intended that the plant will be a self-supporting non-profit establishment, and those who received the training will continue to work as permanent employees.

Mr. Clayton says he enjoys the opportunity he has had to help establish the plant. "The job allows me to interact with people from the top to the bottom of the spectrum," he said. "It requires creativity, imagination and resourcefulness."
