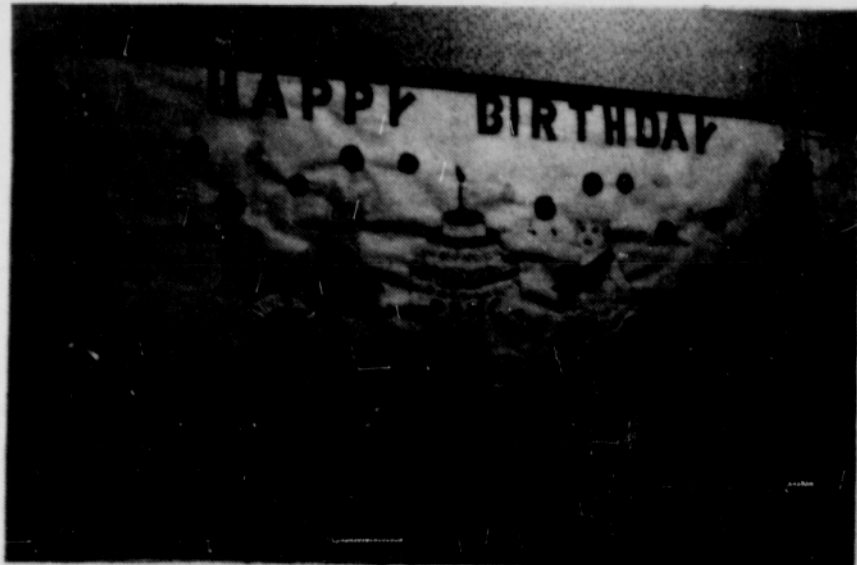




Happy Birthday greetings to guests at Portland Residential Manpower Center's 1st anniversary party on March 5 was extended via this bulletin board in the entrance.

High school dropouts celebrate

The Portland Residential Manpower Center for high school dropouts celebrated the first anniversary of the start of its classes on March 9, 1970, with a four-hour-long party that drew several hundred guests.

The event took place in the cafeteria of the downtown Administration Building at 1022 SW Salmon on Friday, March 5, from 1 to 5 p.m.

A large cardboard tiered -- birthday cake with a huge red candle on top and red, white and blue decorations greeted the guests. Smaller real cakes, one tiered and decorated with "Happy Birthday," were consumed, along with ice cream, tea, coffee and punch in large quantities.

Special guests who stopped by during the afternoon included Robert W. Blanchard, Portland Public School Supt.; Frank Case,

Portland School Board; Donald D. McElroy, Blanchard's executive assistant; Dr. Patricia Swenson of KBPS and KTV; -- Thoms J. Sommerville, Supt. of Multnomah County IED; Ira Mumford, New Careers teachers trainer; Carl Sandoz of the Tri-County Community Council; Fred Park and George Benedict of Youth Opportunity Center, and Anita Juhr, executive director of WICS (Women In Community Service).

The Center offers teen-ager from the Tri-County area, Multnomah, Clackamas and Washington counties, a chance to earn a high school diploma or GED and vocational training in several fields, including electronics, home economics, health and business occupations, shop and metal work and agro-business and food service. The school,

which is part of the Portland - Public Schools, maintains a downtown dormitory for the girls and provides living quarters for the boys at Springdale, on the Sandy river near Corbett. The students also receive free board, medical and dental care and counseling, including psychiatric help if needed. When the student completes the course a short period is spent in work experience or training linkage -- and then the student is ready for a full time job, which the Center helps find.

To enroll in the Center, student must be between 16 and 22 years of age, out of school and unemployed. Applications are accepted at the Youth Opportunity Center.
