

Legislator speaks to NAACP Earn While Learn VIP of the week

Two legislators who represent the East Central sub-district in the Oregon House of Representatives will speak to the Portland Branch NAACP at the regular monthly meeting at 4:00 p.m. on Sunday, April 18 at the Berean Baptist Church 4822 N Vancouver, according to Ellis H. Casson, President.

Representative Earl Haas, Democrat, and Representative Robert Elliott, Republican, will speak on "How Things Look In Salem," with special emphasis on those bills which will affect people in the area.

Representative Haas, House Minority Leader, has fought the sales tax, worked for home tax relief, and a better deal for Portland taxpayers' share of state funds for schools. He helped formulate and pass the "beach bill" which preserved

lic. His bill which increased orphans' compensation benefits was the first increase in over 20 years.

Representative Elliott was the first chairman of the Urban Affairs committee, has served on Public Welfare, Highways, Education committees, sponsored legislation for safety measures for the handicapped, tax relief for those over 65, increase in state funds for Portland schools, protection of Oregon beaches. He is very active in efforts to improve Child Care facilities. He has always opposed the sales tax.

A report on the NAACP membership drive now in progress under the co-direction of James Lee and C.A. White will be given at the meeting on Sunday. To date, several hundred members have been added to the rolls. Goal for the year is 2,000, Mr. Casson said.

The meeting is open to the public.

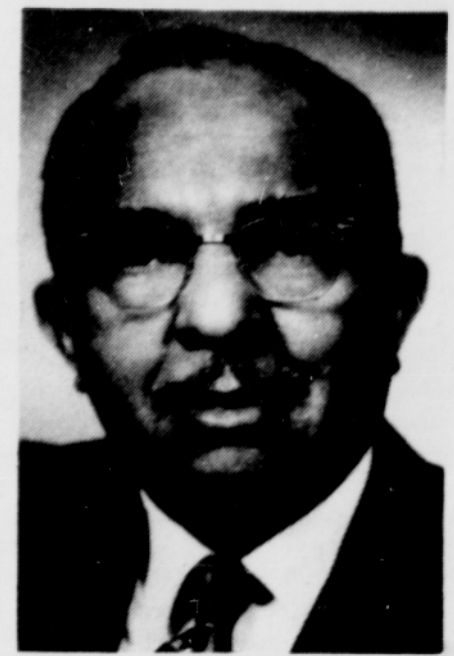

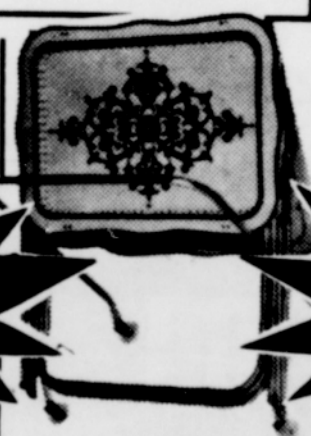

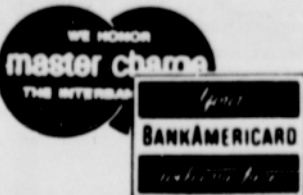
