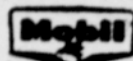

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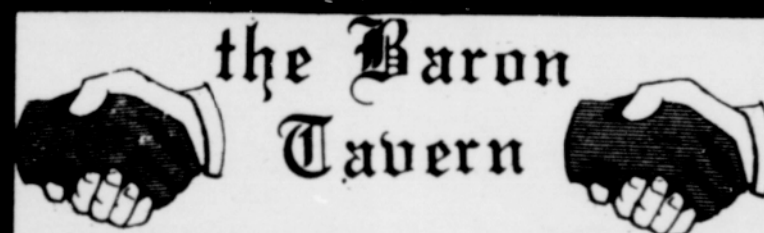
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Ecology

A six-week Lecture and Discussion series designed to provide a general background to the ecological crisis and give practical advice on what Citizens can do to effect changes beneficial to the environment.

Definition of the problem. The problem will be generally defined as unlimited population and consumption within a framework of finite resources. What changes in our attitudes and values must be made if we are to avoid environmental catastrophe? (April 12)

Discussion of the effects of unlimited population and possible solutions to the problem. (April 19)

Consumption What we can do through conscious and selective consumption, to lessen environmental pollution. Pollutants will be named, their effects on the environment discussed, and alternatives suggested. (April 26)

Pollution Pollution control agencies (CWAPA, DEQ/EQC), their respective jurisdictions, how they operate, and how citizens can help them do their job. (May 3)

Environmental Legislation A workshop on the specific bills before the Oregon Legislature and how citizens can work for their passage. What is needed and how to get it. (May 10)

Individual Commitment Avenues of involvement: environmental organizations (OEC, NEDC, OCCA, etc.), City Planning Commission, City Council, Tri-Met; Churches, PTA, civic groups. Education through speakers, study groups, and initiation of action projects (May 17) Sponsored by Portland Community College Whitford School Library 7935 S. W.
