

Kinsey hot line

Major pieces of legislation are being heard almost every day as each chamber labors to get through the vast number of bills which must be voted upon before the session ends.

In the House this week one of these important bills was passed on the floor from the House Environment Committee. HB 1065, known as the nuclear siting bill, would establish a 14-member Nuclear and Thermal Energy Council with authority to determine the siting and monitoring of future power plants with 250,000 or more kilowatts of electricity. The Council would consist of the directors of specified state agencies including the Department of Environmental Quality, State Water Resources Board, Fish Commission, Game Commission, State Engineer, State Forestry Department, State Geologist, Department of Agriculture, and Economic Development Division, as well as two representatives from statewide environmental organizations, a radiologist, a person appointed by the County government in which a site is being reviewed, and a public member designated chairman of the Nuclear and Thermal Energy Council.

The Council would be required to conduct studies to determine areas suitable for thermal power plants, and to conduct a 24-hour monitoring of the environmental and ecological effects of the construction and operation of thermal power plants. The bill would give the Council authority to order the operation of a plant halted without a hearing or any prior notice if the Council judges the activities of the plant to be detrimental to public health and safety. Once an application for a plant site is received, the bill would also require that a hearing must be held within 60 days and a decision made within 90 days following the hearing.

In the area of consumer protection the House has taken a major step in establishing a comprehensive consumer protection package, which is supported by most of the House members and is designed to provide protection against defective products and unscrupulous and deceptive trade practices.

The major proposals in this legislation are designed to: (1) redefine deceptive trade practices and plug loopholes which are not covered by present law; (2) provide the State Attorney General with authority to establish by ruling that certain conduct is misleading and therefore prohibited; (3) permit individual citizens to bring suit for damages against a company arising out of a willful deceptive trade practice, which present law does not allow; (4) prohibit referral sales; (5) provide restrictions against home solicitation sales of consumer goods and services; (6) require that telephone solicitors identify themselves and reveal the purpose of their call within the first 30 seconds.
