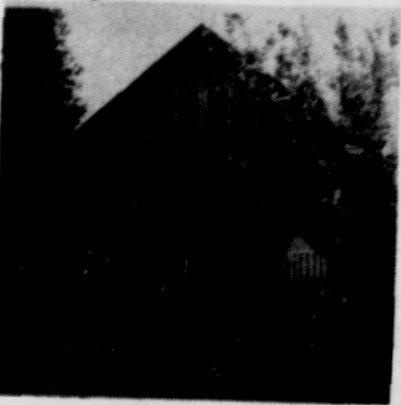

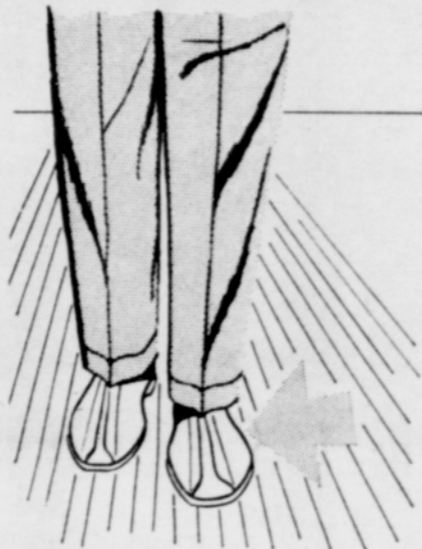

Foot Position
