

Computer Chatter for Women Urbanist from Paris to speak at PSU

Jacqueline Beaujeu-Garnier, one of Europe's leading urbanists, will speak on "Urbanism and Urban Growth in Paris and its Region" at 1 p.m. Monday, May 10 in 294 Smith Memorial Center at Portland State University.

Presently Miss Beaujeu-Garnier is a visiting professor at the University of Minnesota.

A geography professor from the University of Paris, she has written numerous articles and books on urban geography and population. She has also directed work on the Atlas of Paris and its Environment.

The public is invited to the free event co-sponsored by PSU's Geography Department and the Academic Activities Committee.

Summer Study

Persons with a background in the Serbo-Croatian language have the opportunity to study this summer in Yugoslavia at Zadar on the Adriatic, a coastal resort in Dalmatia, July 27 to September 18.

After completion of the nine-credit summer program in Dalmatia, students can participate during the academic year in PUS's Zagreb Institute, a year-long program now in its fifth year.

Government grants have been received for both programs. The grants pay the round trip transportation of the students and supplement their living expense. The grants include \$25,000 for the Dalmatia program and \$17,000 for the Zagreb Institute.

Dr. Charles White, assistant dean of international education, believes that the program not only allows students a chance to study in Yugoslavia, but provides a good training opportunity for persons interested eventually in entering the increasing trade and commerce market with Eastern Europe.

Persons who have not already completed the two-year Serbo-Croatian language requirement may enroll in intensive second year Serbo-Croatian offered June 14 to July 7 in PSU's summer term.

A member of the PSU foreign languages faculty and native Serbo-Croatian speaker, George Kovic, resident director, will be an instructor in the Dalmatia with Marijana Cesarec, a member of the University of Zagreb faculty.

The resident director of the Zagreb program for 1971-72, Victor Dahl, is a member of the PSU faculty.

Language study will be the emphasis of the Dalmatia program.

However, the Zagreb Institute, an overseas extension of PSU's Central European Studies Center allows students to take concentrated study in the field of their choice at the University of Zagreb from October 4 to May 26.

Youth Vote measured by Harris Poll

Quakertown, PA., Free Press "The belief that 18 to 20 year-old-vote will have little effect on the national election is being refuted by the result of a sampling by the Harris Survey. It found a deep generation gap over many issues that are in the public consciousness and that may polarize the voters in 1972. Such issues as pollution control equality for blacks, troop withdrawal from Viet Nam by 1971,

joint space exploration with the Soviets and increased aid to the poor found the new voters 13 to 33 percent more in favor than their elders. How many will vote their convictions, and how many their party affiliations, will have much to do with the result of the coming election. Politicians should know that the youthful voters will have a real impact."
