

PSU student named to national youth committee

Marla Cowling, 23-year-old psychology major at Portland State University, was elected to a 28-member national advisory committee at the White House Conference on Youth in Estes Park, Colorado last week.

The committee will meet three times within the coming year in Washington, D.C. Their efforts will be directed primarily toward implementing the recommendations made by the youth delegates.

With a total working budget of \$150,000, committee members are expected to operate a speakers bureau of delegates, plan institutional visits and give testi-

mony before legislative bodies monitor institutional response to conference recommendations and prepare and distribute follow-up reports to delegates.

Marla, who was nominated as a delegate to the Conference by the State Commission on Youth served on the task force on drugs. In addition to the recommendation to legalize marijuana, the task force also proposed the ban of all drug advertising except in professional journals and to take the drug user out of the criminal context.

Other recommendations passed by the youth delegates included: the ratification of

Washington D.C. as a state with full state rights, de-emphasis of trade with South Africa until that nation recognizes equality for its minority people, legalization of sexual behavior between consenting, responsible individuals and the establishment of an all-volunteer army with a citizens' advisory committee.

In addition to recommending the federal government increase its educational allocations from the present 3.67% to 25% the delegates suggest state and local governments review their appropriations as well.

Marla was one of 12 delegates representing Oregon at the con-

ference, which was attended by 1,000 youths and 500 adults from around the country.

Approximately 150 workshops were organized at the conference around ten major task forces concerned with the areas of foreign relations, poverty,

drugs, legal rights and justice, environment, values, ethics and culture, the draft and national service, education and economics and employment.
