Woman's Day Celebration Vancouver Avenue First Baptist Church Dr. O. B. Williams, pastor Sunday May 30, 1971—8:00 p.m. Mrs. Fannie C. Thompson, Guest Speaker.

Mrs. Fannie C. Thompson, of Tucson, Arizona; President of the Woman's Auxiliary National Baptist Convention of America received her education in the public schools and Simmons University of Louisville, Kentucky.

Before moving to Tucson in 1958 Mrs. Thompson served as president of the Women's Department of the Kentucky Baptist State Body for 14 years. Before becoming president of her National Convention, she was its Field Secretary for 16 years, Second Vice President 7 years and First Vice President 3 years.

In 1955 Mrs. Thompson attended the Baptist World Alliance in London, England. While abroad, she toured several countries, including Egypt and the Holy Lands. 1970 attended the Baptist World Alliance in Tokyo, Japan with an extended trip around the world.

Currently, Mrs. Thompson is active in the Friendship Missionary Baptist Church (Tucson) Missionary Consultant for the Women's Division of Arizona General Baptist State Convention. A member of the Executive Committee of the North American Baptist Women's Union, conductor of the Women's Missionary Department of the National Baptist Sunday School and Baptist Training Union Congress, a member of the Executive Committee of the Women's Department of the Baptist World Alliance and a member of the National Board of Managers of Church Women United.

Arts in Oregon symposium

"The Visual Arts and The Environmental Crisis" is the theme of an Arts in Oregon Symposium to be presented at Portland Community College May 22. The meeting will open at 8 a.m. with an evaluation of current efforts to head off the visual environmental crisis, by Dr. Karl Dittmer, Portland State University dean of science. Other speakers will include Lloyd Keefe, director of the Portland Planning Commission; Don Driscoll, Eugene architect; and Mark Terry, author of "Teaching for Survival." Moderator for the discussion will be Terry Melton, executive secretary for the Oregon Arts Commission.

A buffet luncheon will be served at noon in the College Center building. Candy Daming, chairman of the project, will report on "The Suitcase Museum" activities of the Portland Junior League.

The afternoon program will feature information about "A Way That Really Works," reporting on efforts to sensitize school children to "learn to see" through classroom and other activities.

Mrs. Roberta Gaughan of the Portland Public Schools will report on "Eco-Aesthetic Continuum--You and Your World," and Mrs. Jean Gillen will present a slide show titled "The Choices We've Made."
