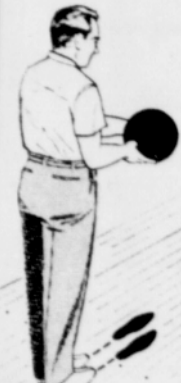

FACE THE PINS AT RELEASE

Sidney Wicks from UCLA battling Spencer Haywood...a clash of seven-footers, Bill Smith from Syracuse and Pembroke Burrows from Jacksonville...a first look at Charley Yelverton from Fordham...

Those will be among highlights of a pair of June clashes between the rookie squads of the Portland Trail Blazers and the Seattle SuperSonics.

The home-and-home games—Friday night, June 18 in Seattle and Saturday night, June 19 in Memorial Coliseum—will climax the Trail Blazers' second rookie camp which will open June 13 at Lewis & Clark College.

Haywood, of course, is no rookie. The former Most Valuable Player in the American Basketball Association played 33 games for Seattle last season and averaged 20.6 points a contest.

But he has been granted special permission to play in this year's rookie game.

Proceeds from the game in Memorial Coliseum will go to the Albina Ministerial Alliance, with all seats priced at \$2.

Tickets for the Portland game will go on sale Monday, June 7, at Memorial Coliseum, at Meier & Frank Company's downtown store and at Stevens & Son Jewelry in the Lloyd Center.

The Friday night game in Seattle will be televised live back to Portland by KPTV, channel 12, with Jimmy Jones handling play-by-play.

The presence of Haywood will provide a tough first professional test for Wicks, Portland's top draft choice who won virtually every honor in the country last season in leading UCLA to the Bruins' fifth straight national championship.

Portland has signed eight of its top 10 draft choices and all are expected in action...Yelverton from Fordham...Larry Steele from Kentucky...Hector Blondet from Murray State...Jim Day from Morehead State...Gene Knolle from Texas Tech and John Sutter from Tulane...plus Wicks and Smith.

Seattle's lineup will include—besides Haywood and Burrows—Jake Ford, who played only five games with the Sonics last season because of military service, and 6-9 Jeff Smith, fifth-round draft pick from New Mexico State.

Portland's second rookie camp will open medical examinations and lectures on Sunday June 13. From Monday through Thursday, June 14-17, the rookies will drill twice daily at Lewis and Clark.

Evening practice sessions—starting at 7 o'clock—will be open to the public on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday nights June 15-17. Morning practices and the Monday night session will be closed.

About 14 players are expected to report to the Trail Blazers' workouts—with only invited free agents and supplementary draft choices supplementing the top selections who already have signed contracts.

PARTICIPATE

Three students from Portland State University, Helen Pittman a junior in business education, Mildred Jones, a junior in sociology and Avel Waters, a freshman in political science, and a student from the University of Portland, Mary Stephen, a junior in general science, have been chosen to participate in Operation Crossroads Africa. Organized in 1958 by Dr. James H. Robinson, director of the U.S. State Department Advisory Council on African Affairs, the program is designed to provide an opportunity for North Americans and Africans to develop a mutual understanding and respect through living and working together.

In the past 13 years the program, which makes a tangible contribution to Africa's needs and provides the educational experience of exposure to another culture, has sent over 3,000 students to 33 African countries, according to Inno Ukaeje, assistant professor in black studies and political science at PSU and chairman of the program in Oregon.

The four Portland students, among 200 Americans chosen from colleges and universities across the United States, will go to Nigeria and Ghana.

Students will participate in a variety of projects this summer such as work camps, involving construction, a medical project, teacher and secretarial training programs and a social work program. At the end of the summer the students will spend 10 days travelling as a group in Western Africa, meeting local and national leaders.

As a part of the exchange program, Ukaeje expects between 27 and 30 African students to visit Portland this summer as part of their United States tour.

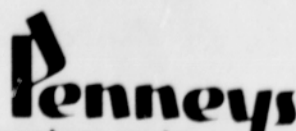
While Operation Crossroads Africa provides a scholarship of \$800 for each participant, private contributions are necessary to cover the total cost of the program.

Knolle, who set a Texas Tech scoring record with 572 points last season, is the eighth draft choice to sign for the 1971-72 season.

Tenth-round selection Greg Starrick has returned to school for a final season at Southern Illinois, leaving only three draft choices of the top 12 unsigned—Rick Fischer of Colorado State, Bobby Fields of LaSalle and Gene Kennedy of Texas Christian.

"We feel that in Knolle, we have one of the top prospects coming out to the Southwest Conference this year," said Inman. "He played a lot of forward at Texas Tech and he will have to adjust to the back court, but he is working on those skills now."

"Knolle is a good shooter," said Inman, "a very strong kid and one whose great hustle made him one of the most popular players with fans in the Southwest Conference."

Knolle scored 501 points as a junior, an average of 20.9 a game, and averaged 22 points a game as a senior, leading his team in scoring in 14 of 26 games in rebounding in 10 of 26 games.

In top single-game performances, Knolle exploded for 34 points against San Diego State, 33 against University of Pacific and 32 against both University of Washington and Baylor.

Knolle shot 52 percent from the field as a junior and 47.6 percent as a senior and was a strong free throw shooter—77 percent as a junior and 80 percent as a senior.

A New York product (Brandeis High School in St.

Alban's), Knolle transferred to Texas Tech from Ranger Junior College where he averaged 26 points and 19 rebounds a game while hitting 65 percent of his shots from the field.

He was Texas Tech's top scorer in 17 of 24 games as a junior.
