'I'll play as long as Alston wants me'

When Maury Wills, the veteran Los Angeles infielder, was honored at Dodger Stadium several years ago, the message board had to be used four times to get all his credits in.

Yet, says Wills in an article in *Sport* magazine, his biggest baseball thrill has been to take part in winning four pennants for the Dodgers.

As a team player, then, Wills found it a hard pill to swallow when he was traded to the Pirates at the close of the 1966 season — probably because he walked out on a team.. post-season tour of Japan.

Two years later he went to Montreal where, he says, he experienced the worst moments of his career. After one rough night of booing by 25,000 Montreal fans, Wills retired — only to return after the Dodgers reacquired.. his contract.

Now he's where he wants to be, playing for the manager he respects most in baseball — Walter Alston. In fact, Wills says, he'll play as long as Alston runs the team.

It's no secret that Wills would like to succeed Alston. His credentials include a winning year as manager in the Mexican League.

Would becoming the first black big league manager mean anything to him? "Nothing," he says. "I don't want a job just because I'm black. I want one because somebody thinks I'm capable of handling it."

Joe Louis Chairs Watts Golf Open

Former heavyweight boxing champion Joe Louis serve as honorary chairman of the first annual Watts Open Golf Classic, May 30-31, at the Westchester course.

The 57-year old Brown Bomber's acceptance of the chairmanship was jointly announced by Louis and Claude Conrad, director of the Sponsoring Youth Golf Foundation of Compton.

Louis, an avid golfer who is currently associated with Caesars Palace in the capacity of hotel host, said he considered it a "real honor and a privilege to be connected with this worthy project."

Conrad said the celebrity-amateur tournament is primarily designed to raise funds for equipment necessary to expand the instruction program of the Youth Golf Foundation and stimulate interest in golf among minority groups in the

Southern California area. "One of our basic objectives is to develop competition among high schools and colleges in Southern California," Conrad said.

"Competitive golf in our schools can open new avenues of endeavor and opportunity to thousands of black and Mexican-American youngsters," he said, "possibly leading to lucrative professional participation in the sport."

Included in the star-studded field are Fred Williamson (Julia Show), Greg Morris (Mission Impossible), Pro Bill Wright from Sportsman Park, Curt Wilson of Las Vegas and several local business firms are sponsors of at least four players each.

A Closer Look at Frazier

NEW YORK — In the days before the Frazier-Alti fight for the heavyweight championship, Frazier's only constant companions were his manager, his chauffeur, his security man ... and writer Dave Wolf.

Wolf, a close friend of Frazier since 1967, authored an article in the current *Sport* magazine titled "A Very Close Look at Joe Frazier."

Wolf first met Frazier four years ago, when he was working as a sports reporter for Life.

"They wanted to do a story on an obscure heavyweight," Wolf says, "so they sent me to Philadelphia to see Frazier because it was closest."

It took Wolf three days before Frazier would see him, possibly, Dave feels, because Frazier at the time didn't want to have anything to do with a white reporter.

Once he did get together with Frazier, they became immediate friends.

They spent time in the ghetto together and rapped together and Frazier impressed Wolf as "a straightforward fellow, easy to be around."

This kind of trust explains his access to Frazier before and after the fight.

It'll be a major league summer in the city parks of Portland.

The Portland Trail Blazers, in cooperation with Pacific Northwest Bell, will present a series of 10 basketball clinics in 10 different city parks.

At each clinic there will be instruction by the coach and players of Oregon's first major league team. There will be demonstrations of basketball skills. And there will be actual court participation by the youngsters.

The master of ceremonies for each of the clinics will be Bill Schonely, voice of the

Trail Blazers, who made "Rip City" two of the most exciting words on the Portland sports scene.

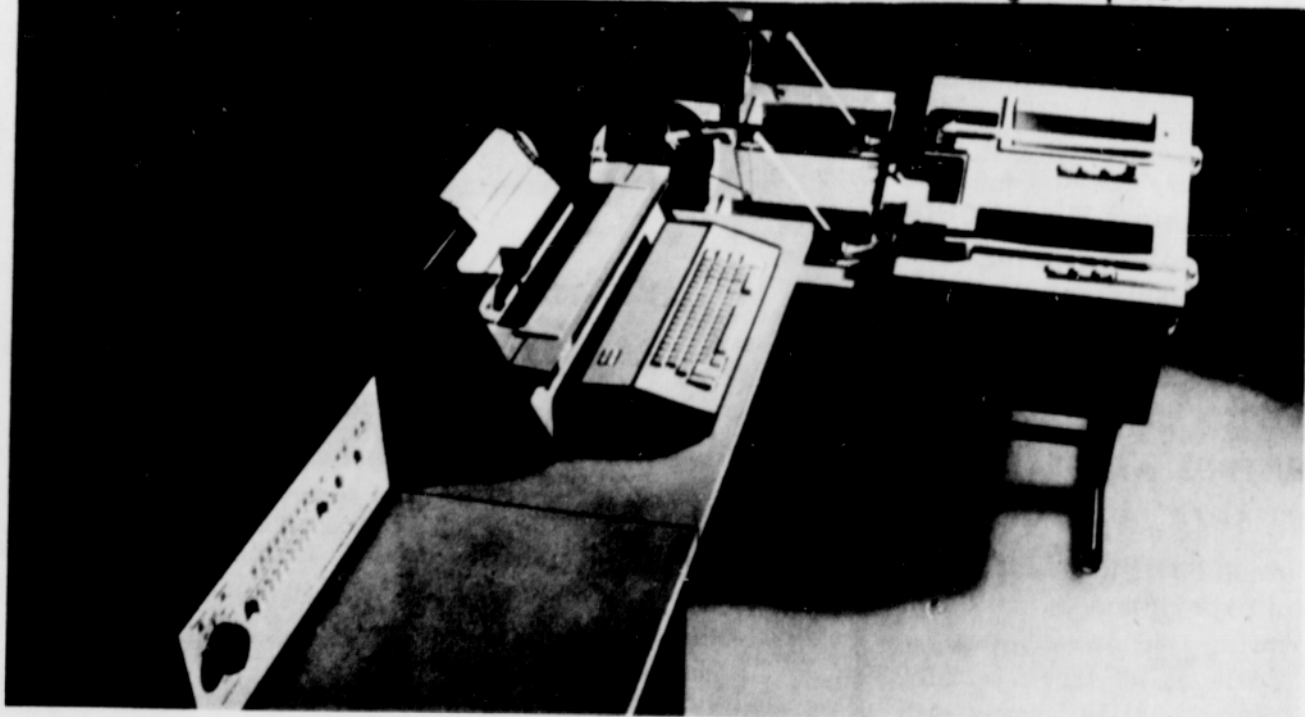
