"I never had the opportunity of going to a prom until I attended the one my school gave on my ranch in Oklahoma. Yes, that was the only time," he mused. As we talked in his office on Dr. Martin Luther King dr., his mind went back to his childhood days when he spent the best years of his life on the family farm, in Okla. He was born there Jan. 21, 1924.

The various duties of the house and farm were divided. It was in these earlier years of his life that young Roberts learned responsibility. Many times when he had finished his work after returning from the Wheatley elementary school, he would sit and gaze into the great distant where the sky bent low to kiss the earth. Or sometimes after the rains, he wondered if he would ever find his pot of gold at the end of a rainbow.

One day he was told that he was going to a big city up north to live with his brother and sure enough he boarded a train and Chicago and attending Burke Elementary School. When he graduated, he enrolled at Englewood High.

There were many days when little Herman didn't eat properly, there were many nights when the energetic boy didn't sleep because his body ached in the icy apartment where he lived. While his teeth chattered, his mind was active shaking body and singing a song of determination. "When I get grown, I'm going to change this thing."

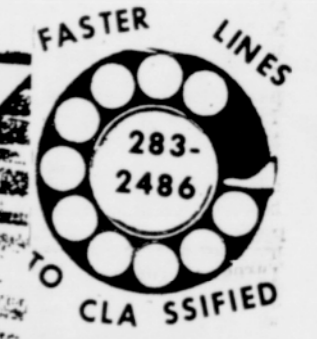
