Black Ministers reimburse Presbyterian donation

Controversy over a \$10,000 grant from the United Presbyterian Church to aid in the defense of Angela Davis has prompted a group of Black ministers to reimburse the Church for the entire sum. The New York ministers pledged that the money would be paid to the denomination by June 15.

Presbyterians across the country have criticized the grant which was made by the Council on Church and Race out of the Emergency Fund for Legal Aid last month. The Black ministers explained their action, "In this was we assume personal responsibility for the United Presbyterian grant to The Angela Davis Legal Defense Fund....we stand, therefore, fully behind efforts to insure that Angela Davis will receive a fair trial on the allegations that have been made against her."

Mrs. Ralph Stuir, moderator of the denomination, said "once again the blacks have found it necessary to make the first move of love and reconciliation."

The central office is located on 1535 N. E. 17th, and is staffed by director Dick Mastbrook, Gay Krieger and Liz Sheppard program organizers and Colene Carlson secretary.

This organization is requesting that church and other community related organizations offer facilities, volunteers and financial support to further the program in all areas of the Portland-Metropolitan area. There is a need for many such centers to meet the demands of the elderly.

The staff workers hope that Loaves and Fishes will be within the reach of every senior citizen who desires, food, fun, and friendship.
