

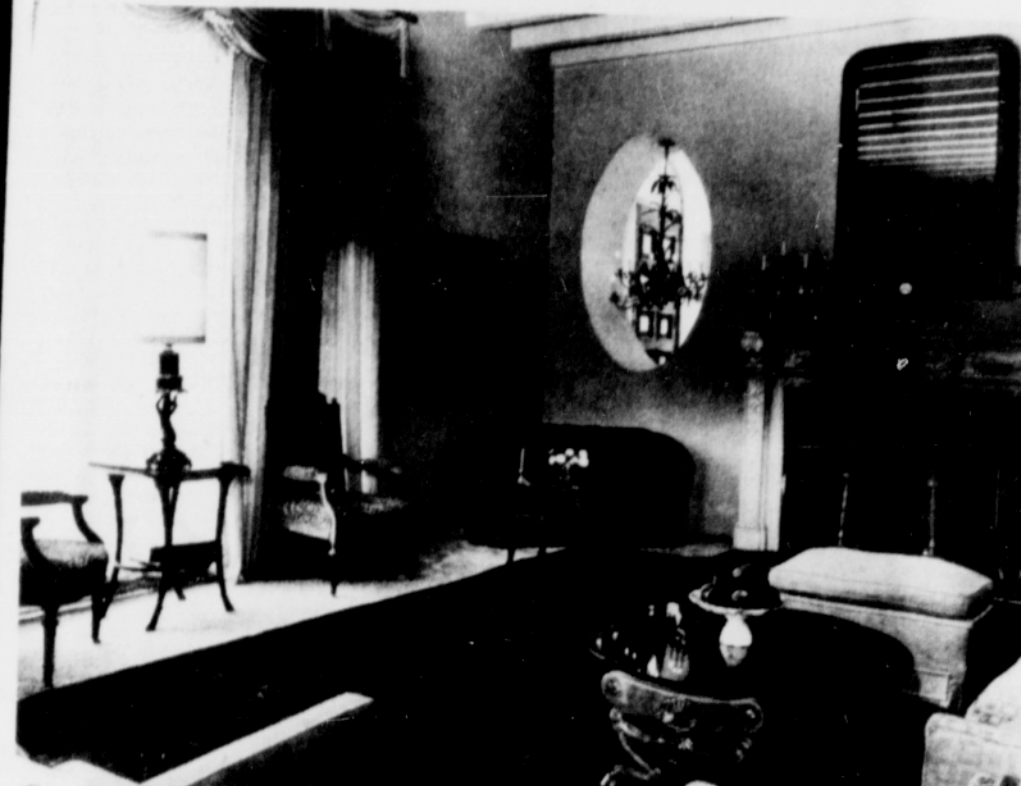
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Beautify your home

These rooms could serve as guides for refurbishing an older local home into a beautiful residence.

Starting with the basics, perhaps the best floor in a room could be sanded and money saved, by using an area rug immediately under furniture upholstered in a contrasting color.

It is apparent that the decorators in the pictures used a mixture of decorating ideas and made use of the old adage, "Always combine things of beauty and strength". They have put together modern, traditional, antique and almost grotesque! When you look around your house and take an inventory of what furniture can be kept and re-upholstered or refinished. Do not be in haste to dispose of all you have and start anew.

Perhaps some of the very things that are "passed" and unattractive now will turn out to be the focal point of your decorating after they are redone. Remember straight, clean lines are great, but they are uninteresting and pretty much alike.

Even though it appears leggy, it is perfect for a lamp table as they have used it. The glass top coffee table is modern ottoman and chairs. The upholstered pieces are of square shape and would, with a change of covers, go with almost any decor.

The dining room general effect could be attained by anyone, with a bit of imagination. Tables and chairs that are durable and perhaps not of the best wood, are beautiful enameled with white, black or antiqued any color.

SPRAY WEEDS AND HELP YOUR LAWN BREATHE

Weed pulling has become a full time summer job for some people. Unfortunately, there is no pay. The only thing you have to show for the work is grass-stained knees, calloused hands, and an aching back. The net result of all the dandelion digging and weed pulling is a lawn that looks like a pock-marked battlefield.

Letting weeds grow is no answer either because they rob your lawn of necessary water and food and steal the sunlight from grass seedlings that need the precious light to manufacture plant food. Weeds are not the cause of a poor lawn, but the result of one. Weed seeds often hibernate in the soil for years and then, when conditions are favorable, they sprout and grow rapidly.

While early spring control is the best way to stop weeds and crabgrass before they get a foothold in your lawn, weed control is an all-summer job. Just when you think your lawn problems are under control, the hot, dry weather hits and weeds establish a new beachhead.

By mowing your lawn and watering and fertilizing it regularly, you can keep your lawn growing and breathing properly — leaving few open places for weeds to sprout. The aim in lawn weed control is to establish a thick, vigorous-growing turf that will keep weeds from invading your yard in the first place.

According to H. D. Hudson Manufacturing Company, makers of sprayers and dusters, an easy, efficient way to weed your lawn is to let chemistry do the work for you. You can start out with a pre-emergent treatment on the crabgrass. Once crabgrass has sprouted, you will need a post-emergent crabgrass killer, applied strictly in accordance with the manufacturer's directions.

Success with weed killing mixtures depends a lot on knowing just which one to use and how to use it. Selective weed control mixtures will quickly clear out broadleaf weeds such as dandelions and plantain without ruining lawn grasses.

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Flammability standard

Children's pajamas, nightgowns, robes and other sleepwear up to and including size 6X and offered for sale in interstate commerce after July 30, 1972 will have to meet a flammability standard just issued by the Commerce Department, Notes Commerce Clearing House.

Noncomplying goods after that date will have to bear a label indicating they are flammable and should not be worn near sources of fire. Goods made after July 30, 1973 that do not comply with the standard will be ruled off the market.

The standard requires that fabrics and garments must not ignite and burn when tested in a vertical position by a brief exposure to flame.

Provision is also made for fabrics that melt and drip upon contact with flame. The standard requires testing not only the fabrics used in the sleepwear, but also the parts of garments that become more flammable by adding seams or trim. In lieu of testing the garment itself, the basic fabric may be tested under circumstances simulating a garment, using the same seams of trim that will be used in the finished garment.

In announcing the standard, the Department gave notice that there may be a need for

a sampling plan as part of the sleepwear standard. It has also been reported that although a treatment process exists to make some garments conform to the standard, neither the machinery nor the procedures presently exist for treatment of about 80 percent of the sleepwear now on the market.

ROYAL SUNDAE-BEST CAKE

CAKE:
1 package (18½ oz.) white cake mix
1 pint vanilla ice cream, softened
¾ cup water
3 eggs

TOPPING:
1 package (6½ oz.) white frosting mix
¾ cup water

½ cup miniature marshmallows
Chocolate or strawberry ice cream

To prepare cake: In large mixing bowl blend cake mix, vanilla ice cream, water and eggs at low speed until all ingredients are moistened. Beat 2 minutes at medium speed. Turn into a well-buttered and lightly floured 12-cup bundt pan. Bake in a preheated 325° oven 45-55 minutes. Cool in pan on wire rack 5 minutes; remove from pan to wire rack to cool completely.

To prepare topping: In a small mixing bowl place frosting mix. Bring water and marshmallows to boiling; add to frosting mix. Beat at high speed 3-4 minutes or until desired consistency. Serve cake slices topped with scoops of chocolate or strawberry ice cream and marshmallow topping.

Milk Products Help Keep Famous Beauties Lovely

Milk, inside and out, seems to have wonderful effects on the human body. Sultry, shapely Italian film star Sophia Loren, who reportedly eats spaghetti with gusto, never diets and ignores most beauty routines, has discovered that using milk as a skin detergent keeps her 36-year-old complexion flawless. And it's said Ultra Violet, Andy Warhol's lovely superstar, conducts interviews from a relaxing milk bath.

An Independent Federal agency, the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission was established under the Civil Rights Act of 1964. Title VII of the Act prohibits discrimination based on race, color, religion, sex, and national origin in hiring, upgrading, and all other conditions of employment.

The separation rate dipped from 4.4 per hundred in April to 4.2 in May. This was attributed to a small decline in layoffs and discharges. Quits were up slightly over the period of 1.6 per hundred. This was still the lowest quit rate for May in nine years.

Turnover was down considerably from a year ago. Layoffs, quits, and other separations were below the year earlier level. The accession rate was lower than that of one year ago. Lower turnover tended to reduce requirements for replacements.

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
