Mfg. Jobs

The number of job vacancies in manufacturing edged up at the end of July, the U.S. Department of Labor reported today. Hiring of new factory workers also rose in July. Job Vacancies in manufacturing totaled 93,000 at the end of July (not seasonally adjusted), slightly above the revised June level of 89,000. The June-to-July rise was about equal to last year's. Over the year, the number of job vacancies has declined by 33,000, or 26 percent.

Despite the small rise in the number of manufacturing vacancies, the job vacancy rate, at five per 1,000 jobs in July, was unchanged for the third consecutive month.

'Living Fund' Driving Safety Check

A "living fund," unlike a will, will never see its financial provisions and details publicized in news stories. The "living fund"—basically a title found more meaningful when referring to a revocable living trust—is completely confidential. The rights of yourself and your family to financial privacy are both respected and guaranteed.

What transpires with a "living fund" is strictly between yourself, your attorney and your trust officer. On the other hand, when a will is probated it automatically becomes a matter of public record, open to inspection by anyone and everyone.

Few people have any reason short of curiosity to peruse will files at the county courthouse, but anyone who wishes can. Also, there are certain people, ranging from honest grave monument salesmen to shady operators with designs of a different sort to press upon recently bereaved families, who regularly comb through county will files.

Setting up a "living fund" and insuring complete privacy is actually quite simple. First, you sit down for a detailed planning session centering on your aims and assets with your attorney and a representative of the trust department. Your lawyer then draws up for your signature a trust agreement naming the bank as your trustee. Most people, incidentally, name themselves as the beneficiaries of their "living funds," in order to put the bank's experienced, professional investment management services to work for them.

You may, if you choose, name other beneficiaries to receive the trust income upon your cont. on page 5

Ushers Scholarship Tea

Blood Clotting Research

A research scientist at the Yale School of Medicine has isolated and identified an agent found in all body tissues that triggers the clotting of blood.

Clotting is a necessary part of the repair processes following injury, but when it happens inside the coronary or brain artery it can provoke a heart attack or stroke.

The isolated agent, called tissue factor, is presumably there to protect the body against injury by calling the repair machinery into play. But Dr. Yale Nemerson, an Established Investigator of the American Heart Association, hopes his studies may lead to the development of other agents to inhibit clots that can pose a danger to life.

An associate professor of medicine at Yale in New Haven, Conn., Dr. Nemerson described his findings at a special AHA Research Committee meeting at which Established Investigators entering the last year of their five-year tenures exchanged reports on the fruits of their Heart Fund-supported studies.

In a subsequent interview, Dr. Nemerson explained that blood clotting is a complex chain-reaction among several proteins. It produces a substance called thrombin, which activates fibrinogen to make the thready material that forms the actual clot. Tissue factor is the spark for one of several thrombin-forming pathways. The factor is thought to lie on the surface of cells in all body organs. The best guess, according to Dr. Nemerson, is that when exposed to moving blood—as in the case of injury—the tissue factor acts like a sponge, sucking one of the proteins from the plasma of leaking blood. Tissue factor and this protein form a chemical that activates other proteins in the clotting chain.

Part of the evidence that tis-

sue factor provokes clot formation comes from test tube studies by Dr. Nemerson in which the addition of ground-up tissue to whole blood reduced clotting time from 20 minutes to 12 seconds.

Nor did it matter from which organ of the body tissue factor was taken. His studies with cows showed that an identical tissue factor can be extracted from the brain, spleen, liver, lung, kidney, or other organs.

Dairy Farmers Called Practicing Ecologists

Long before ecology became a popular word or issue, dairy farmers were practicing ecologists, conserving the environment and working with nature to earn a living. Dairy farms fit into nature's cycle and cannot be replaced successfully by concrete or high rise apartments.

Because vegetation produces oxygen, the millions of acres of dairy pastureland provide clean air, an important contribution in an era when growing metropolitan areas and industrial complexes spread pollution.

contribution. Mr. Harrington is a graduate of Duke University, which like North Carolina Central University, is situated in Durham.

North Carolina Central University is a liberal arts college with an enrollment of 3,600 students. It offers graduate programs at the master's degree level and 23 academic disciplines, with professional programs offered in Law and Library Science.

The University was founded in 1910 as a private religious institution, received state support in 1923, and became a four-year state-supported college in 1925. It is believed to have been the first state-supported liberal arts college for Negroes in the nation.



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The enrollment of the university includes a substantial majority of students from low income families. More than half the student body in recent years has come from families whose total income was less than \$5,000.

As a result, the university's fund raising efforts prior to the current campaigns were directed toward raising scholarships for its students. The faculty endowment drive was instituted in 1968 to meet the increased competition for qualified university faculty.

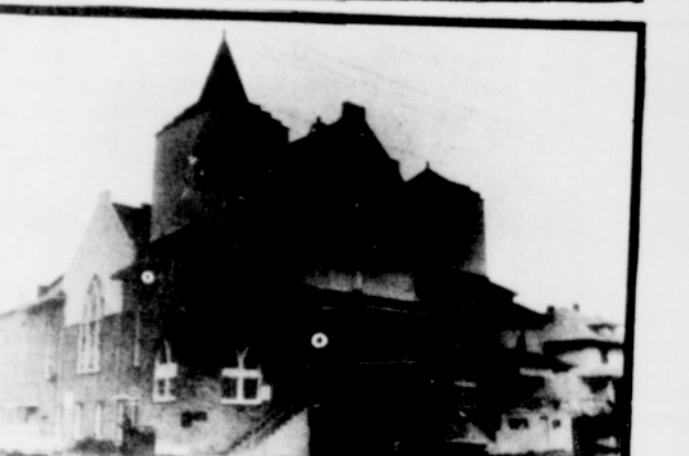
