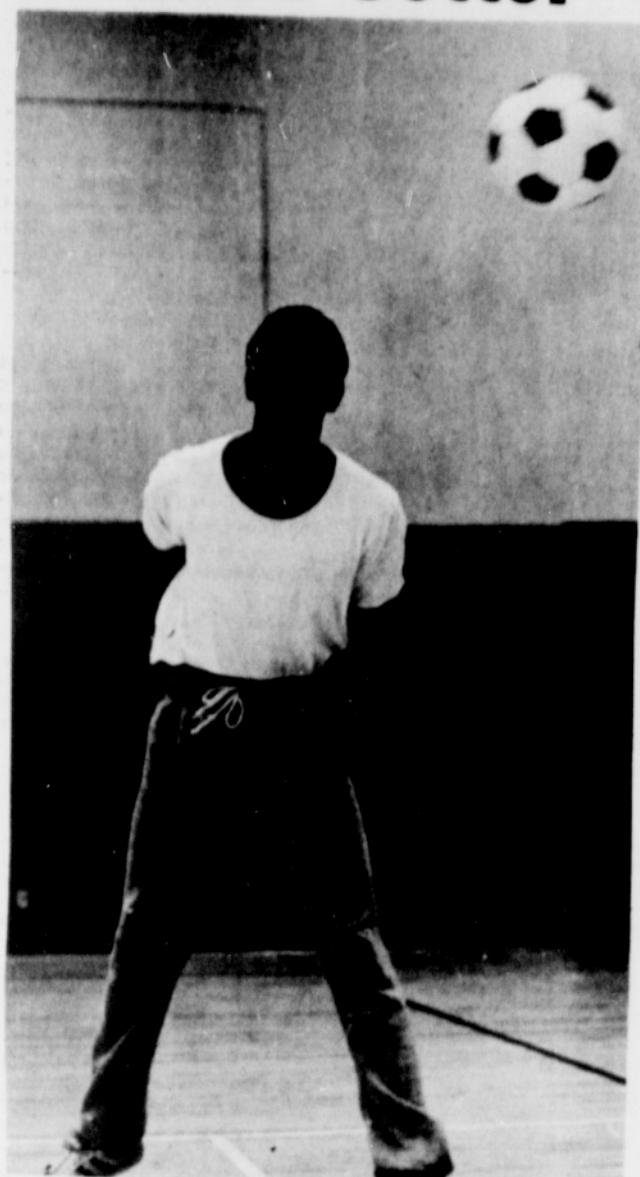


Falcon Soccer

Over the past two years, the sport of soccer has suddenly blossomed and developed among the high schools of northwestern Oregon. Many athletic departments are taking the relatively inexpensive plunge into soccer now, and the sport is experiencing a rapid growth. But among the first torch-bearing schools for the sport was Bishop Dagwell Hall, located in Raleigh Hills. The Hall began an informal soccer program many years ago, and entered the Oregon High School League in 1969.

The Dagwell Falcons are proving to be perennial contenders in the league. Under the skilled guidance of coach John Hicks, the Falcons placed a very close second in 1969, and were close playoff contenders in 1970. The future holds a real shine of promise as the Falcons enter 1971. Several returning lettermen will help make the Falcons contenders again, and the new schedule appears to be favorable. Among the returning lettermen are Tucker Livingstone and Charles Seaborn, seniors; Greg Amerson, a junior; and Miles Miller, a sophomore. All of these players are from Portland, and boast a wonderful helping of skills. Livingstone and Seaborn helped anchor the 1970 Falcon defense which once held opponents scoreless for more than 250 consecutive minutes, or about four games' worth. Livingstone displays the finesse while Seaborn wields the power. Amerson, now with a season of experience at forward, utilizes an incredible deftness around the goal which sets him up excellently for a score. Part of the 1970 "Black Tornado," an all-black front line, Greg appeals to the discriminators' tastes as a silent, swift, and effective worker at his position. Miller is following in a difficult shadow of a past Falcon goaltending great, but word is that Miles has the potential to be BDH's best ever. The lean and lanky Miller has three full seasons ahead in which many believe he will become the finest two-way goalie in the Hall's history.

There are other returnees and aspirants, from out of town, who reside at the school.

The season opens at the Cathlamet school on September 11 with the annual six-a-side tournament, and then the Falcons will play five home and three road tilts to complete the regular season. The semifinals, or playoffs as they are commonly called, may begin as early as October 22, with the state final on October 30. The stress for competition in the league lies in making the playoffs. There are two divisions in the league, each containing a set number of teams. The second place finisher in each division plays the first place finisher in the other division, which amounts to two games. The winners of those two games will then play each other for the state championship.

The league, though recognized by the Oregon Schools Activities Association (OSAA), boasts members from all sizes of schools. Large AAA schools like La Salle of Milwaukie compete on the same scale as small A schools like Bishop Dagwell, whose official name has become Oregon Episcopal. The OSAA, however, has not yet sanctioned the soccer project, which has definitely proven

Trail Blazers young team

The Portland Trail Blazers—perhaps the youngest team in the history of professional major league sports—began serious fall training Wednesday.

Fifteen players, with an average age of 23.9 years, reported for daily workouts at Hillsboro High School and at Pacific University in Forest Grove.

In late player moves, the Trail Blazers dropped one veteran, Ed Manning, and added one rookie, David Lindstrom, a product of University of Puget Sound.

Manning, who averaged 7.1 points a game for the Trail Blazers last season, was placed on waivers Tuesday morning by Stu Inman, director of Player Personnel.

Lindstrom, a 6-2, 185-pound guard, is a 1969 UPS graduate who played last season for the Australian national team.

"He was particularly effective on tour of the Big Ten last season," said Inman, "averaging 20 points a game in head-to-head competition with such first-round draft choices as Fred Brown of Iowa and Jim Clearmons of Ohio State."

Portland's 15-man training camp roster now includes seven holdovers from the first Blazers team, one new professional (John Baum from Chicago) and seven rookies, led by top draft choice Sidney Wicks from UCLA.

Oldest of the Blazers is guard Stan McKenzie, who will be 27 on October 6. Youngest is Wicks who will be 22 on September 19.

From September 15 through September 21, the Blazers will drill in the mornings at Hillsboro High School and in the evenings at Pacific University.

Ten pre-season tests are on tap for the Blazers before their National Basketball Association opener in Memorial Coliseum on Friday night, October 15, against the Seattle SuperSonics.

The Blazers will face Seattle on Friday night, September 24, in Spokane; on Saturday night, September 25, in Pendleton, and on Sunday night, September 26, in Hood River to begin the pre-season schedule.

Two tests are scheduled in Memorial Coliseum.

The Blazers will face the world champion Milwaukee Bucks — in the first head-to-head test of Lew Alcindor against Sidney Wicks — on Friday night, October 1. This will be the second game of a double-header, with Seattle playing the Golden State Warriors in the opener at 6:30 p.m.

And on Sunday, October 3, the Blazers will meet Seattle at 4 p.m. in the first game of a basketball-hockey twin bill, with the Portland Buckaroos meeting the Seattle Totems in the second test.
